RETIREMENT BENEFITS. Provides for benefits for survivors of hazardous duty plan members killed by an intentional act of violence. (2/3 - CA 10s29(F)) (gov sig)

AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 11:478(E), 585, the introductory paragraph of 586(A) and
3	586(B), 587, 618(B), and 3685(A)(2)(e) and to enact R.S. 11:478(F), 586(A)(5), and
4	604(F), relative to hazardous duty retirement plans and sub-plans; to provide for
5	members killed in the line of duty by an intentional act of violence; to provide for
6	benefits for survivors of these members; to provide for qualifications to receive these
7	benefits; to provide for benefit calculation; to provide for notification; to provide for
8	an effective date; and to provide for related matters.
9	Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published.
10	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
11	Section 1. R.S. 11:478(E), 585, the introductory paragraph of 586(A) and 586(B),
12	587, 618(B), and 3685(A)(2)(e) are hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 11:478(F),
13	586(A)(5), and 604(F) are hereby enacted to read as follows:
14	§478. Benefits payable to certain members killed in the line of duty; survivor
15	benefits; corrections officers hired on or before December 31, 2010
16	* * *
17	E. The provisions of Subsections A through D of this Section shall be

applied retroactively to July 1, 1996.

F. If the member's death resulted from an intentional act of violence and the member has a surviving spouse, minor, or handicapped or mentally incapacitated child or children, the amount of the total benefit shall equal one hundred percent of the member's average compensation. The benefit shall be shared equally by the surviving spouse and children. When a child who is not handicapped or mentally incapacitated no longer meets the definition of minor child under R.S. 11:403, his benefit shall cease, and the remaining beneficiaries shall have their shares adjusted accordingly.

§585. Death benefits of surviving spouse

A. If any member's death results from injury received in the line of duty, survivor benefits shall be payable as provided for in accordance with this Section. This benefit is payable only if the member dies as a direct result of injuries sustained in the line of duty.

<u>B.</u> The <u>benefit for the</u> surviving spouse <u>of any member with twenty-five</u> years or more of service with the department, or commission, whose death results from injury received in line of duty, shall be pensioned at seventy-five shall equal:

- (1) Seventy-five percent of his the member's average compensation if the member had twenty-five years or more of service with the department or commission.
- (2) and on sixty Sixty percent of his the member's average compensation if said employee the member had credit for less than twenty-five years of service with the department; or commission.
- (3) One hundred percent of the member's average compensation, regardless of years of service, if the member's death resulted from an intentional act of violence.

<u>C.</u>; provided, however, that said pension <u>The survivor benefit</u> shall be paid only so long as she <u>the surviving spouse</u> is eligible under the provisions of this

2	§586. Death benefits of minor children
3	A. If there is no surviving spouse to receive the pension due a widow of any
4	member benefit provided under R.S. 11:585, minor children of the deceased
5	member shall receive a monthly pension in the proportions set out as follows:

7	(5) If the member's death resulted from an intentional act of violence and
8	the member has a minor, or handicapped or mentally incapacitated child or
9	children, the amount of the total benefit shall equal one hundred percent of the
10	member's average compensation. The benefit shall be shared equally by the
11	children. When a child who is not handicapped or mentally incapacitated no
12	longer meets the definition of minor child under R.S. 11:403, his benefit shall

20	If there is no surviving spouse and no minor children eligible to receive a

22	the deceased member shall be paid to the parent or parents of the deceased member,
23	if they, or either of them, derived their main support from the member. The pension
24	shall equal:
25	(1) One hundred percent of the member's average compensation if the
26	member's death resulted from an injury received in the line of duty, and such
27	injury resulted from an intentional act of violence.

B.(1) If the member has a surviving spouse, minor, or handicapped or mentally incapacitated child or children, the amount of the total benefit shall equal eighty percent of the member's average compensation. The benefit shall be shared equally by the surviving spouse and children. When a child who is not handicapped or mentally incapacitated no longer meets the definition of minor child under R.S. 11:403, his benefit shall cease, and the remaining beneficiaries shall have their shares adjusted accordingly.

(2) If the member's death resulted from an intentional act of violence and the member has a surviving spouse, minor, or handicapped or mentally incapacitated child or children, the amount of the total benefit shall equal one hundred percent of the member's average compensation. The benefit shall be shared equally by the surviving spouse and children. When a child who is not handicapped or mentally incapacitated no longer meets the definition of minor child under R.S. 11:403, his benefit shall cease, and the remaining beneficiaries shall have their shares adjusted accordingly.

4	(2) Benefits shall be payable to survivors of a deceased member who had at
5	least five years of creditable service and who dies before retirement as specified in
6	the following:

8	(e) Provided that in the case of death of any member resulting from injury
9	received in line of duty survivors' benefits shall be paid regardless of number of
10	years of service and shall be equal:
11	(i) sixty Sixty percent of his the member's final salary payable to his widow

13	under eighteen years of age if there is no eligible surviving widow spouse; or to his

22	Section 2. The cost of this Act, if any, shall be funded through additional employer
23	contributions in compliance with Article X, Section 29(F) of the Constitution of Louisiana.
24	Section 3. The Louisiana State Employees' Retirement System board of trustees shall
25	electronically notify all members of the legislature when a survivor benefit is granted
26	pursuant to the provisions of this Act.
27	Section 4. The Sheriffs' Pension and Relief Fund board of trustees shall
28	electronically notify all members of the legislature when a survivor benefit is granted
29	pursuant to R.S. 11:2178(D)(4).

Section 5. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on the day following such approval.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the survivor benefits for the spouses and children of certain members of Louisiana State Employees' Retirement System (LASERS) who are in the various hazardous duty plans, including wildlife agents, certain public safety and correction employees, and harbor police, who were killed in the line of duty or died from the direct result of an injury received while in the line of duty.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for the survivor benefit for the spouse and children of a member of a hazardous duty plan killed in the line of duty by an intentional act of violence. <u>Proposed law</u> provides that the benefit shall be equal to 100% of the member's average compensation without regard to the amount of time that the deceased was a member of the plan.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the LASERS board of trustees shall electronically notify all members of the legislature when a survivor benefit is granted pursuant to proposed law.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the Sheriffs' Pension and Relief Fund board of trustees shall electronically notify all members of the legislature when a survivor benefit is granted pursuant to <u>present law</u> (R.S. 11:2178(D)(4)).

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.

Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Retirement to the original bill

1. Includes all members of any hazardous duty sub-plans for purposes of granting a survivor benefit for those members kill in the line of duty by an intentional act of violence.
