EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

Proposed law may result in an indeterminable decrease in SGF expenditures in the Department of Public Safety and Corrections - Office of Juvenile Justice (OJJ) to the extent youth are released from custody by a court ruling. Proposed law will allow youth placed in the custody of OJJ after adjudication of Article 897.1 acts, including first degree rape, aggravated kidnapping, and armed robbery, the benefit of parole and/or modification of sentence at the discretion of the court. Currently, OJJ has approximately 58 youth in custody for these offenses. The court will determine whether a youth is granted parole or a modification. To the extent youth are granted parole or a modification, OJJ will not expend \$146.68 daily to house a youth in secure placement. If a judge modifies the sentence and steps the youth down from secure care to a nonsecure placement, the average daily cost is \$98.53. In the event the youth are granted parole (goes back home), there is an estimated \$25 daily cost associated for Electronic Monitoring Program (EMP) and/or added to the caseload of a Probation & Parole Officer.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
