EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

<u>Proposed law</u> will likely result in an indeterminable increase in SGF expenditures in the Department of Public Safety and Corrections – Corrections Services (DPSC) as a result of the minimum imprisonment term increasing from five years to twenty years if a person is convicted of unlawful manufacturing, distributing, dispensing, or possessing with intent to distribute heroin or its equivalents.

SGF expenditures will increase by \$54.21 per offender per day if an offender is housed in a state facility or \$24.39 for a state offender housed in a local facility. An offender sentenced to the custody of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections - Corrections Services for one year would increase SGF expenditures by \$19,786.65 (\$54.21 per day x 365 days) if housed in a state facility and \$8,902.35 (\$24.39 per day x 365 days) if housed in a local facility. Approximately 50% of state offenders are housed in state facilities and approximately 50% of state offenders are housed in local facilities.

For informational purposes, Corrections Services reports there were 141 new admissions in FY 17 for the above mentioned crimes. Of these, 9 offenders were habitual offenders who had an average sentence length imposed of 13 years. Proposed would result in a minimum additional 7 years of imprisonment for habitual offenders assuming the number of admissions and corresponding sentences in FY 17 is typical. The remaining 132 received an average sentence length imposed of 7 years. Proposed law would result in a minimum additional 13 years of imprisonment for these individuals assuming the number of admissions and corresponding sentences in FY 17 is typical. The annual incarceration cost for 141 offenders is \$2,789,917.65 (\$19,786,65 per year per offender x 141 offenders) if housed in a state facility or \$1,255,231.35 (\$8,902.35 per year per offender x 141 offenders) if housed in a local facility.

NOTE: Any potential significant expenditure impact would likely fall outside the five-year window of the fiscal note.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
