1 AMENDMENT NO. 1

- 2 On page 1, line 4, after "license;" and before "and to" insert "to provide relative to insurance
- 3 coverage; to provide for notification requirements;"
- 4 AMENDMENT NO. 2
- 5 On page 1, line 10, after "(F)." and before "No" insert "(1)"
- 6 AMENDMENT NO. 3
- 7 On page 1, line 12, after "propellants, and" delete the remainder of the line and insert
- 8 "recycled military ordinance materials in excess of a net explosive weight of five
- 9 <u>hundred fifty thousand pounds</u>"
- 10 AMENDMENT NO. 4
- On page 2, line 2, change "Subsection" to "Paragraph"
- 12 AMENDMENT NO. 5
- On page 2, between lines 3 and 4, insert the following:
- 14 "(2) Any licensed person or business in this state employed to destroy, 15 dispose, mitigate, or otherwise work with demilitarized explosives, propellants, 16 or recycled military ordinance materials in excess of a net explosive weight of 17 five hundred fifty thousand pounds shall immediately notify the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, explosives control unit, and provide proof of 18 19 liability insurance in an amount not less than fifty million dollars within twenty-20 four hours of obtaining possession of the explosives, propellants, or materials. 21 This insurance policy shall cover damage, mitigation, and remediation efforts 22 caused by the blast, fire, fragmentation, discharge, dispersal, seepage, 23 migration, release, escape, pollution, or other work involving the use of 24 explosives, propellants, or materials as a result of the storage, handling, 25 movement, use, manipulation, or other action causing the detonation of 26 explosives by the applicant or an employee or agent of the licensee. Nothing in 27 this Paragraph shall apply to a federal military installation located in this state."
