CONFERENCE COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

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Keyword and summary of the bill as proposed by the Conference Committee

PHARMACEUTICALS. Provides relative to prescription chart orders. (8/1/18)

Report rejects House amendments which would have:

- 1. Stipulated that nothing in <u>proposed law</u> shall be construed to require chart orders for any medications administered in-center in outpatient dialysis facilities or for any medications for treatment of end-stage renal disease administered as part of home-based dialysis treatments.
- 2. Added prohibition on use of prescription drug information for data mining or marketing purposes in the Louisiana Pharmacy Practice Act.

Digest of the bill as proposed by the Conference Committee

<u>Proposed law</u> adds the defined term "chart order" and its corresponding definition to <u>present law</u>, the Louisiana Pharmacy Practice Act, to apply to electronic or paper orders for drugs or devices for inpatients or residents of an institutional facility.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for the use of chart orders with respect to electronic prescribing of noncontrolled legend drugs. <u>Proposed law</u> further provides for bidirectional electronic transmission of chart orders in certain circumstances from the institutional facility to the pharmacy.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the institutional facility is the only party to the prescription drug chart order that is required to maintain a copy of the prescriber's signature.

Effective August 1, 2018.
