2	Proposing to Add Article I Section 10.1 of the Constitution of Louisiana, relative to public
3	office; to prohibit convicted felons from seeking or holding public office within a
4	certain time period; and to specify an election for submission of the proposition to
5	electors and provide a ballot proposition.
6	Section 1. Be it resolved by the Legislature of Louisiana, two-thirds of the members
7	elected to each house concurring, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the state, for
8	their approval or rejection in the manner provided by law, a proposal to add Article I Section
9	10.1 of the Constitution of Louisiana, to read as follows:
10	§10.1. Disqualification from Seeking or Holding an Elective Office or
11	<u>Appointment</u>
12	Section 10.1.(A) Disqualification. The following persons shall not be
13	permitted to qualify as a candidate for elective public office or hold elective
14	public office or appointment of honor, trust, or profit in this state:
15	(1) A person actually under an order of imprisonment for conviction of
16	<u>a felony.</u>
17	(2) A person who has been convicted within this state of a felony and who
18	has exhausted all legal remedies, or who has been convicted under the laws of
19	any other state or of the United States or of any foreign government or country
20	of a crime which, if committed in this state, would be a felony and who has
21	exhausted all legal remedies and has not afterwards been pardoned either by
22	the governor of this state or by the officer of the state, nation, government, or
23	country having such authority to pardon in the place where the person was
24	convicted and sentenced.

1	(B) Exception. The provisions of Paragraph (A) of this Section shall not
2	prohibit a person convicted of a felony from qualifying as a candidate for
3	elective public office or holding such elective public office or appointment of
4	honor, trust, or profit if more than five years have elapsed since the completion
5	of his original sentence for the conviction.
6	(C) The provisions of Paragraph (A) of this Section shall not prohibit a
7	person from being employed by the state or a political subdivision.
8	Section 2. Be it further resolved that this proposed amendment shall be submitted
9	to the electors of the state of Louisiana at the statewide election to be held on November 6,
10	2018.
11	Section 3. Be it further resolved that on the official ballot to be used at said election
12	there shall be printed a proposition, upon which the electors of the state shall be permitted
13	to vote YES or NO, to amend the Constitution of Louisiana, which proposition shall read as
14	follows:
15	Do you support an amendment to prohibit a convicted felon from seeking or
16	holding public office or appointment within five years of completion of his
17	sentence unless he is pardoned?
18	(Adds Article I, Section 10.1)
