<u>Existing law</u> provides that a court with original criminal jurisdiction or juvenile jurisdiction may require that a statement of a protected person be recorded on videotape and may be used in a juvenile or criminal proceeding.

<u>Existing law</u> defines"protected person" as any person who is a victim of a crime or a witness in a criminal proceeding and who is either of the following:

- (1) Under the age of 17 years.
- (2) Has a developmental disability.

<u>New law</u> adds to the <u>existing law</u> definition of "protected person" an adult eligible for protective services pursuant to <u>existing law</u>.

Existing law, relative to protective services, defines "adult" as any individual 18 years of age or older, or an emancipated minor who, due to a physical, mental, or developmental disability or the infirmities of aging, is unable to manage his own resources, carry out the activities of daily living, or protect himself from abuse, neglect, or exploitation.
