11	(1) "Fire employee" includes any person employed in the fire department of
12	any municipality, parish, or fire protection district maintaining a full-time regularly
13	paid fire department, regardless of the specific duties of such person within the fire
14	department, and who is under investigation with a view to possible disciplinary
15	action, demotion, or dismissal. "Fire employee" also includes employees of
16	nonprofit corporations under contract with a fire protection district or other
17	political subdivision to provide fire protection services, including operators of

Present law defines a "fire employee" for purposes of procedures applicable to the investigation of such an employee as anyone employed in a full-time fire department, regardless of his specific duties, who is under investigation.

Proposed law retains present law and additionally defines "fire employee" to include employees of nonprofit corporations under contract with a fire protection district or other political subdivision to provide fire protection services.

Effective August 1, 2019.
