HEALTH SERVICES: Requires the provision of certain information to patients or parents of patients prior to administration of an immunization or a vaccine

AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 37:1218.1(A) and to enact R.S. 37:936, 980, 1218(6), 1274.2,
3	and 1360.31.1 and Part XIII-A of Chapter 11 of Title 40 of the Louisiana Revised
4	Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 40:2199.11, relative to the administration
5	of immunizations and vaccines; to require that certain healthcare providers and
6	facilities furnish information to patients or parents of patients prior to the
7	administration of an immunization or vaccine; to provide specifications for such
8	information to be furnished to patients or parents of patients; and to provide for
9	related matters.
0	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
1	Section 1. R.S. 37:1218.1(A) is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 37:936, 980,
12	1218(6), 1274.2, and 1360.31.1 are hereby enacted to read as follows:
13	§936. Administration of immunizations and vaccines; requirements
14	Prior to administering an immunization or a vaccine to a patient, a registered
15	nurse shall provide to the patient, or, if the patient is a minor, the parent or guardian
16	of the patient, thorough written information concerning the immunization or vaccine
17	that addresses, at minimum, all of the following:
18	(1) The diseases or conditions that the immunization or vaccine is intended
9	to prevent or treat.

26	A pharmacist may administer an influenza immunization to any person seven
27	years of age or older without a prescription or medical order contingent upon all of
28	the following provisions:

1	(6) Prior to administering an influenza immunization to a patient, the
2	pharmacist shall provide to the patient, or, if the patient is a minor, the parent or
3	guardian of the patient, thorough written information concerning the immunization
4	that addresses, at minimum, all of the following:
5	(a) The effectiveness of the immunization.
6	(b) Any contraindications associated with the immunization.
7	(c) The possible side effects of the immunization.
8	(d) The ingredients of the immunization.
9	(e) Instructions for submitting a report to the Vaccine Adverse Events
10	Reporting System described in Paragraph (3) of this Section.
11	§1218.1. Administration of immunizations and vaccines other than influenza
12	immunizations
13	A. A pharmacist may administer to an individual age seventeen or older an
14	immunization or a vaccine without a patient-specific prescription or medical order
15	if the immunization or the vaccine is administered in conformance with the most
16	current immunization administration protocol as set forth by the United States
17	Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Advisory Committee on Immunization
18	Practice. At the time that a pharmacist administers an immunization or vaccine under
19	the provisions of this Section, the pharmacist shall also inform the individual that the
20	administration of an immunization or vaccine under this Section is not to be
21	construed as being in lieu of an annual checkup with the individual's primary care
22	or family physician. Additionally, in connection with the administration of
23	immunizations and vaccines, the pharmacist shall comply with all of the following
24	requirements:
25	(1) The pharmacist shall report each immunization to the Louisiana
26	Department of Health, office of public health's Louisiana Immunization Network for
27	Kids Statewide at the time of the immunization or as soon as reasonably practicable
28	thereafter, as this is the official state vaccination record.

(2) The pharmacist shall report all adverse events he observes or which are
reported to him to the Vaccine Adverse Events Reporting System, the cooperative
program of the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the
United States Food and Drug Administration for vaccine safety, or its successor
program; and further, the pharmacist shall refer the patient with an adverse event to
an immunization for appropriate medical care.
(3) The pharmacist shall maintain for at least two years a record of each
immunization administered.
(4) The pharmacist shall obtain the appropriate credentials to administer
immunizations from the board, as administratively defined, prior to administering
any such immunization.
(5) The pharmacist shall request the name of a patient's primary care
provider prior to the administering of any immunization. If the patient identifies
such primary care provider to the pharmacist, the pharmacist shall notify the primary
care provider, by written or electronic communication, as soon as reasonably
possible thereafter that the immunization was administered.
(6) Prior to administering an immunization or a vaccine to a patient, the
pharmacist shall provide to the patient, or, if the patient is a minor, the parent or
guardian of the patient, thorough written information concerning the immunization
or vaccine that addresses, at minimum, all of the following:
(a) The diseases or conditions that the immunization or vaccine is intended
to prevent or treat.
(b) The effectiveness of the immunization or vaccine.
(c) Any contraindications associated with the immunization or vaccine.
(d) The possible side effects of the immunization or vaccine.
(e) The ingredients of the immunization or vaccine.
(f) Instructions for submitting a report to the Vaccine Adverse Events
Reporting System described in Paragraph (2) of this Subsection.

23	to prevent or treat.
24	(2) The effectiveness of the immunization or vaccine.

11	vaccines are administered shall ensure that prior to the administration of an
12	immunization or a vaccine to a patient, the patient, or, if the patient is a minor, the
13	parent or guardian of the patient, is provided thorough written information
14	concerning the immunization or vaccine that addresses, at minimum, all of the
15	<u>following:</u>
16	(1) The diseases or conditions that the immunization or vaccine is intended
17	to prevent or treat.
18	(2) The effectiveness of the immunization or vaccine.
19	(3) Any contraindications associated with the immunization or vaccine.
20	(4) The possible side effects of the immunization or vaccine.
21	(5) The ingredients of the immunization or vaccine.
22	(6) Instructions for submitting a report to the Vaccine Adverse Events
23	Reporting System, the cooperative program of the United States Centers for Disease
24	Control and Prevention and the United States Food and Drug Administration for
25	vaccine safety, or its successor program.
26	B. The Louisiana Department of Health shall promulgate all such rules in
27	accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act as are necessary to implement the
28	provisions of this Part.

Abstract: Requires the provision of information to patients, or parents of patients who are minors, prior to administration of an immunization or a vaccine and provides specifications for such information.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires that prior to administering an immunization or a vaccine to a patient, the physician, physician assistant, registered nurse, practical nurse, or pharmacist administering the immunization or vaccine shall provide to the patient, or, if the patient is a minor, the parent or guardian of the patient, thorough written information that addresses, at minimum, all of the following:

- (1) The diseases or conditions that the immunization or vaccine is intended to prevent or treat.
- (2) The effectiveness of the immunization or vaccine.
- (3) Any contraindications associated with the immunization or vaccine.
- (4) The possible side effects of the immunization or vaccine.
- (5) The ingredients of the immunization or vaccine.
- (6) Instructions for submitting a report to the federally managed Vaccine Adverse Events Reporting System.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires all healthcare facilities licensed by the La. Department of Health at which immunizations or vaccines are administered to ensure that prior to the administration of an immunization or a vaccine to a patient, the patient, or, if the patient is a minor, the parent or guardian of the patient, is provided thorough written information concerning the immunization or vaccine that addresses, at minimum, all of the factors enumerated above.
