TAX/AD VALOREM-EXEMPTION: (Constitutional Amendment) Provides for local option for the homestead exemption

1	A JOINT RESOLUTION
2	Proposing to add Article VII, Section 20(A)(11) of the Constitution of Louisiana, to provide
3	relative to ad valorem taxation; to authorize a parish governing authority to change
4	the amount of the homestead exemption with voter approval; to require certain
5	millage adjustments associated with implementation of a change in the homestead
6	exemption; to provide for effectiveness; to provide for submission of the proposed
7	amendment to the electors; and to provide for related matters.
8	Section 1. Be it resolved by the Legislature of Louisiana, two-thirds of the members
9	elected to each house concurring, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the state of
10	Louisiana, for their approval or rejection in the manner provided by law, a proposal to
11	amend Article VII, Section 20(A)(11) of the Constitution of Louisiana, to read as follows:
12	§20. Homestead Exemption
13	Section 20.(A) Homeowners.
14	* * *
15	(11)(a) Notwithstanding any provision of this constitution to the contrary,
16	the exemption provided for in this Paragraph shall be effective and applicable unless
17	and until a parish governing authority adopts a resolution or ordinance adjusting the
18	amount of the exemption, which resolution or ordinance shall be effective only if
19	approved by the electors of the parish. Any change in the amount of the exemption
20	shall become effective on the first day of the calendar year following the year in

1	which the change was approved by the electors, and is deemed to be an instance of		
2	implementation of the provisions of this Subparagraph.		
3	(b) The total amount of ad valorem taxes collected by any taxing authority		
4	in any year in which the provisions of this Subparagraph are implemented shall not		
5	be increased or decreased as a result of such implementation above or below the		
6	amount of ad valorem taxes collected in the year preceding the implementation. To		
7	accomplish this result, it shall be mandatory for each affected taxing authority to		
8	adjust millages upwards or downwards without regard to millage limitations		
9	otherwise contained in this constitution. The maximum authorized millages shall be		
10	increased or decreased in proportion to the amount of adjustment upward or		
11	downward. Thereafter, such millages shall remain in effect unless changed as		
12	permitted by this constitution. In no way shall the provisions of this Subparagraph		
13	be interpreted to affect the imposition and collection of revenue from a new millage		
14	or the renewal of a millage.

16	Section 2. Be it further resolved that the provisions of the amendment contained in		
17	this Joint Resolution shall become effective on January 1, 2020.		
18	Section 3. Be it further resolved that this proposed amendment shall be submitted		
19	to the electors of the state of Louisiana at the statewide election to be held on October 12,		
20	2019.		
21	Section 4. Be it further resolved that on the official ballot to be used at the election,		
22	there shall be printed a proposition, upon which the electors of the state shall be permitted		
23	to vote YES or NO, to amend the Constitution of Louisiana, which proposition shall read as		
24	follows:		
25	Do you support an amendment to authorize a parish governing authority to		
26	adjust the amount of the homestead exemption subject to voter approval?		
27	(Effective January 1, 2020) (Amends Article VII, Section 20(A)(11))		

DIGEST

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Abstract: Authorizes adjustment of the amount of the homestead exemption by a parish governing authority with voter approval and requires a one time millage adjustment to ensure collection of the same amount of revenues in the year of implementation.

Present constitution authorizes the levy of ad valorem taxes on property within Louisiana.

<u>Present constitution</u> establishes an exemption from state, parish, and special ad valorem property taxes for the bona fide homestead of the property owner, for the first \$7,500 of assessed valuation.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> retains <u>present constitution</u> and adds authorization for a parish governing authority to adjust the amount of the homestead exemption by the adoption of a resolution or ordinance, to be effective only if approved by the electors of the parish. One time millage adjustments are required in instances where the homestead exemption is adjusted so as to ensure the same amount of revenue for taxing authorities.

Provides for submission of the proposed amendment to the voters at the statewide election to be held Oct. 12, 2019.
