MTR VEHICLE/INSPECTION: Eliminates the state inspection sticker requirement for certain vehicles

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 32:1301, 1302, 1304(A)(1), (2), and (3) and (B), 1306(C), and
3	1306.1(A), and to repeal R.S. 32:707.5(D)(3) and 1303, relative to the vehicle
4	inspection sticker requirement; to repeal the inspection sticker requirement for
5	assembled vehicles; and to provide for related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 32:1301, 1302, 1304(A)(1), (2), and (3) and (B), 1306(C), and
8	1306.1(A) are hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
9	§1301. Vehicles without required equipment or in unsafe condition
10	No person shall drive or move on any highway any motor vehicle, low-speed
11	vehicle as defined in R.S. 32:1(40), trailer, semitrailer, or pole trailer, or any
12	combination thereof, unless the equipment upon any such vehicle is in good working
13	order and adjustment as required in this Chapter and the vehicle is in such safe
14	mechanical condition as not to endanger the driver or other occupant or any person
15	upon the highway. Every motor vehicle, low-speed vehicle, trailer, semitrailer, and
16	pole trailer vehicle registered in this state which shall be inspected pursuant to the
17	provisions of this Chapter shall bear a valid safety inspection certificate issued in the
18	state of Louisiana, except as otherwise provided by this Chapter.
19	§1302. Inspection Enforcement by officers of the department

1	A. The Director of Public Safety, members of the State Police and such other
2	officers and employees of the department as the director may designate, may at any
3	time upon reasonable cause to believe that a vehicle is unsafe or not equipped as
4	required by law, or that its equipment is not in proper adjustment or repair, require
5	the driver of such vehicle to stop and submit such vehicle to an inspection and such
6	test with reference thereto as may be appropriate, and issue a citation to the operator
7	of such vehicle.
8	B. In the event such vehicle is found to be in unsafe condition or any
9	required part or equipment is not present or is not in proper repair and adjustment the
10	officer shall give a written notice to the driver and shall send a copy to the
11	department. Said notice shall require that such vehicle be placed in safe condition
12	and its equipment in proper repair and adjustment specifying the particulars with
13	reference thereto and that a certificate of inspection and approval be obtained within
14	<del>5 days.</del>

16	§1304. Secretary to require periodical periodic inspection
17	A.(1) The secretary shall at least once every other year, but not more
18	frequently than twice each year, require that every motor vehicle, low-speed vehicle,
19	trailer, semitrailer, and pole trailer registered in this state commercial motor vehicle
20	registered in this state and required to be inspected pursuant to 49 CFR Part 396,
21	including Part 396.17 and "Appendix G" thereof, and every student transportation
22	vehicle registered in this state and required to be inspected pursuant to LAC
23	28:CXIII.701(A)(3) be inspected and that an official certificate of inspection and
24	approval be obtained for such vehicle. However, overweight and oversize mobile
25	homes requiring a state permit shall not be required to bear a certificate of approved
26	inspection when being moved by a bonded carrier as defined by law nor shall used
27	motor vehicles in transit by a dealer be required to have a certificate of inspection
28	and approval. In addition, the secretary shall require motor vehicles registered in a
29	parish or municipality subject to the federal Clean Air Act, 42 USC 7401 et seq., or

1regulations promulgated by the United States Environmental Protection Agency2requiring performance of the inspection and maintenance (I/M) program, be3inspected in accordance with R.S. 30:2054(B)(8). Nothing in this Section shall be4construed to relieve any operator of a motor vehicle, low-speed vehicle as defined5in R.S. 32:1(40), trailer, semitrailer, or pole trailer, or any combination thereof from6compliance with the provisions of R.S. 32:1301.

7 (2) Such inspection should be made and such certificates obtained with 8 respect to the mechanism, brakes, and equipment of every vehicle vehicles required 9 to be inspected as shall be designated by the secretary. The secretary shall require 10 the inspection of all approved automotive emission control devices installed on 11 motor vehicles required to be inspected and that were produced after model year 12 1980 to insure ensure that such devices are operative and have not been tampered 13 with. However, low-speed vehicles shall not be subject to regular emissions 14 inspections.

(3)(a) The secretary shall formulate and promulgate a set of standards for the
control and regulation of emission control devices on all automobiles and other
motor vehicles <u>subject to inspection pursuant to this Section</u>, which standards shall
be consistent with other federal and state regulations for the installation and
operation of approved emission control devices.

20 The secretary is hereby authorized to make necessary rules and (b) 21 regulations for the administration and enforcement of this Section and to designate 22 any periods of time during which owners of vehicles, subject to this Section, shall 23 display upon such vehicles certificates of inspection and approval and shall produce 24 them on demand of any officer or employee of the department designated by the 25 secretary or any police or peace officer when authorized by the secretary. However, 26 an owner or operator of a light trailer, utility trailer, boat trailer, or farm trailer need 27 only provide a valid inspection sticker on demand of an inspecting officer to be in 28 compliance with the inspection requirements of this Chapter.

1	B. The secretary is hereby authorized to make necessary rules and	
2	regulations for the administration and enforcement of this Section and to designat	
3	any periods of time during which owners of vehicles, subject to this Section, shall	
4	display upon such vehicles certificates of inspection and approval or shall produce	
5	the same on demand of any officer or employee of the department designated by th	
6	secretary or any police or peace officer when authorized by the secretary. Owner	
7	and operators of all motor vehicles, subject to this Section, required to be equippe	
8	with windshields shall display on the lower left hand corner of the windshield a	
9	certificate of inspection affixed thereto by a duly authorized motor vehicle inspection	
10	station. The secretary shall accept the certificate of inspection and approval issued	
11	by any municipality pursuant to any municipal ordinance adopted prior to July 27	
12	1960. However, each person who applies for a motor vehicle inspection tag in the	
13	city of New Orleans shall produce written proof of insurance from an insurer that the	
14	motor vehicle is covered by security and shall declare in writing that he or she	
15	intends to maintain said security at all times while said vehicle is used upon the	
16	highways of Louisiana.

18	§1306. Operation of official inspection stations	
19	* * *	
20	C.(1) (a) A charge or fee shall be charged for each certificate of inspection	
21	and approval issued, as provided in this Subsection.	
22	(b) Persons operating an official inspection station shall offer certificates of	
23	inspection that are valid for both one year and two year periods. The owner of the	
24	vehicle shall have the option of purchasing a one year or a two year certificate. A	
25	charge or fee shall be charged for each year of validity of the certificate of inspection	
26	and approval issued, as provided in this Subsection.	
27	(c) The provisions of Subparagraph (b) of this Paragraph shall not apply to	
28	the inspection programs provided for in Paragraphs (3) and (5) of this Subsection and	
29	to student transportation vehicles.	

1	(2) Except as otherwise provided in this Subsection, for each year of validity
2	of the certificate issued, a charge or fee of ten dollars shall be charged, four dollars
3	and seventy-five cents of which shall be retained by the operator of the motor vehicle
4	inspection station conducting the inspection, four dollars of which shall be
5	transferred to the office of state police for use in traffic law enforcement, and one
6	dollar and twenty-five cents shall be transferred to the office of motor vehicles for
7	expenses associated with the motor vehicle inspection and financial responsibility
8	programs. Included in the inspection shall be the adjustment of headlights when
9	needed and mechanically practical, at no additional cost to the operator of the motor
10	vehicle inspected.

11 (3)(a) (2)(a) For parishes and municipalities that have a vehicle inspection 12 and maintenance program required by the federal Clean Air Act or regulations 13 promulgated by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, an additional 14 eight dollars shall be charged for each inspection that includes the performance of 15 the inspection and maintenance (I/M) program pursuant to the provisions of R.S. 16 30:2054(B)(8) for 1980 or newer model year motor vehicles. The motor vehicle 17 inspection station shall retain six dollars of the additional charge for implementation and performance of the I/M program. Two dollars of the additional charge shall be 18 19 transferred to the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality to implement and 20 operate the inspection and maintenance program.

- (b) The department shall promulgate <u>and adopt</u> rules and regulations
  necessary to implement the provisions of this Paragraph.
- 23 (c) The provisions of this Paragraph shall not apply to any trailer, light
   24 trailer, or semitrailer.
- (4) (3) The maintenance and inspection program and the fees provided for in
  Paragraph (3) (2) of this Subsection shall be discontinued when the I/M program is
  discontinued as allowed by the federal Clean Air Act, 42 USC 7401 et seq., and
  regulations promulgated by the United States Environmental Protection Agency or

agreements with the agency concerning the implementation of this program, or result in any other noncompliance regarding this Subsection.

3 (5) (4) An annual charge or fee of thirty dollars shall be charged for the 4 inspection of all commercial motor vehicles which are required to be inspected under 5 the provisions of Part 396 of Title 49 of the Code of Federal Regulations 49 CFR 6 Part 396, including Part 396.17 and "Appendix G" thereof. No charges or fees other 7 than the thirty-dollar fee shall be charged for a commercial motor vehicle inspection. 8 Of the thirty-dollar fee, the motor vehicle inspection station operator who performs 9 this inspection shall retain twenty-three dollars and seventy-five cents; two dollars 10 and twenty-five cents shall be transferred to the office of motor vehicles for expenses 11 associated with motor vehicle and financial responsibility programs; and four dollars 12 of which shall be transferred to the office of state police for use in traffic law 13 enforcement. Included in the inspection shall be the adjustment of headlights at no 14 additional cost to the operator of the motor vehicle being inspected. The Legislature 15 of Louisiana hereby declares that a commercial motor vehicle inspection is much 16 more extensive than the inspection mandated in Paragraph (2) of this Subsection and 17 that the increase in the fee or charge for the inspection of commercial vehicles is 18 based on the difference in the two types of inspection.

19 (6)(a) (5)(a) The charge or fee for the inspection of student transportation 20 vehicles which are required to be inspected under pursuant to LAC 21 28:CXIII.701(A)(3) shall be twenty dollars. No charges or fees other than the 22 twenty-dollar fee shall be charged for a student transportation vehicle inspection. Of 23 the twenty-dollar fee, the motor vehicle inspection station operator who performs 24 this inspection shall retain fourteen dollars and seventy-five cents; one dollar and 25 twenty-five cents shall be transferred to the office of motor vehicles for expenses 26 associated with motor vehicle and financial responsibility programs; and four dollars 27 shall be transferred to the office of state police for use in traffic law enforcement.

(b) The adjustment of headlights shall be included in the inspection at no
additional cost to the owner or operator of the school bus being inspected.

1	(c) The Legislature of Louisiana hereby declares that a student transportation
2	vehicle inspection is much more extensive than the inspection required of other
3	motor vehicles and that the increase in the fee or charge for the inspection of student
4	transportation vehicles is based on the difference in these types of inspections.

6	§1306.1. Inspection and maintenance program fees; nonattainment area; local
7	election
8	A. Upon adoption of a proposition approved by the voters of a nonattainment
9	area parish as provided for in this Section, seven dollars shall be charged for each
10	inspection that includes the performance of the inspection and maintenance (I/M)
11	program pursuant to the provisions of R.S. 30:2054(B)(8) for 1980 or newer model
12	year motor vehicles. This charge shall be in addition to the charge or fee provided
13	for in <del>R.S. 32:1306(C)(3)(a)</del> <u>R.S. 32:1306(C)(2)(a)</u> .

15	Section 3. R.S. 32:707.5(D)(3) and 1303 are hereby repealed.

Abstract: Eliminates the requirement for certain vehicles to have an inspection sticker.

Present law requires all motor vehicles have an inspection sticker.

<u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by requiring only those vehicles required by <u>proposed</u> <u>law</u> have an inspection sticker.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes certain law enforcement agencies to issue citations for motor vehicles that are unsafe or not equipped according to present law.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires only commercial vehicles and student transportation vehicles have an inspection sticker.

<u>Proposed law</u> also requires those vehicles registered in parishes governed by the U.S. Clean Air Act to obtain an emissions inspection as required under federal law.

Proposed law eliminates the requirement of assembled vehicles to have an inspection sticker.

<u>Proposed law</u> eliminates law enforcement's ability to require drivers to submit to a vehicle inspection and test.
