A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2	To recognize April 10, 2019, as Louisiana Nurse Day at the state capitol and May 6-12,
3	2019, as National Nurses Week in Louisiana.
4	WHEREAS, registered nurses are at the front lines of patient care and are the largest
5	segment of the healthcare workforce in Louisiana and nationally; and
6	WHEREAS, registered nurses provide health care to culturally diverse populations
7	of all ages, with any illness, in all healthcare settings to people of all income levels; and
8	WHEREAS, the cost-effective, safe, and high-quality health services provided by
9	registered nurses will be an increasingly important component of our nation's healthcare
10	delivery system in the future; and
11	WHEREAS, the essential role of the registered nurse in care coordination improves
12	patient-care quality, safety, satisfaction, and outcomes and decreases costs across patient
13	populations and healthcare settings; and
14	WHEREAS, the demand for registered nursing services will be greater than ever in
15	the future because of the aging of the American population, the continuing expansion of
16	life-sustaining technologies, and the explosive growth of healthcare services beyond the
17	hospital setting; and
18	WHEREAS, more qualified registered nurses will be needed to meet the increasingly
19	complex needs of healthcare consumers in this community, which requires a sufficient
20	number of qualified nursing faculty; and

1	WHEREAS, registered nursing has outranked other professions for the past
2	seventeen years as the most trusted profession, maintains ethical standards of practice, and
3	advocates steadfastly for patient well-being; and
4	WHEREAS, registered nurses have the experience and expertise in health services
5	delivery to provide input and perspective on issues impacting the health care of Louisiana
6	citizens; and
7	WHEREAS, the Louisiana State Nurses Association, as the voice for registered
8	nurses in this state, fosters high standards for professional nursing practice for all registered
9	nurses regardless of education level, clinical specialty, or work setting, and advocates for
10	quality health care for the citizens of Louisiana; and
11	WHEREAS, along with the American Nurses Association, the Louisiana State
12	Nurses Association has declared the week of May 6-12 as National Nurses Week, with the
13	theme "4 Million Reasons to Celebrate", in recognition of the vast contributions and positive
14	impact of America's four million registered nurses, including the sixty-six thousand
15	registered nurses licensed in Louisiana.
16	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
17	recognize April 10, 2019, as Louisiana Nurse Day at the state capitol and May 6-12, 2019,
18	as National Nurses Week in Louisiana and encourage all residents of Louisiana to join
19	together in honoring the registered nurses who provide quality care for all of us and who
20	work to improve our healthcare system daily.
21	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the legislature does hereby call for the boards
22	and commissions of this state to recognize registered nurses as a valuable resource for
23	inclusion at all levels where health policy decisions are made.
24	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a suitable copy of this Resolution be transmitted

to the executive director of the Louisiana State Nurses Association.
