EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

<u>Proposed law</u> may result in an increase in SGF expenditures in the Department of Public Safety and Corrections - Corrections Services if a person is convicted of the crime of looting with the specific elements outlined in <u>proposed law</u>. <u>Proposed law</u> increases the maximum imprisonment term from fifteen years to twenty years at hard labor without the benefit of probation, parole, or suspension of sentence.

SGF expenditures will increase by \$60.09 per offender per day if an offender is housed in a state facility or \$24.39 for a state offender housed in a local facility. Each year an offender is sentenced to the custody of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections - Correction Services creates an annual SGF expenditure obligation of \$21,992.03 (\$60.09 per day x 366 days) if housed in a state facility and \$8,926.74 (\$24.39 per day x 366 days) if housed in a local facility.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

<u>Proposed law</u> may result in an indeterminable increase in Local Funds revenue as a result of potential fines if a person is convicted of crime of looting with the specific elements outlined in <u>proposed law</u>. The <u>proposed law</u> changes the maximum fine from \$10,000 to \$25,000. The potential net effect on sentencing decisions cannot be determined and the potential revenue impact is therefore unknown. The potential revenue will accrue to the local governing authority.
