Abstract: Requires residential treatment facilities licensed pursuant to the Behavioral Health Services Provider Licensing Law to provide access to medication-assisted treatment for patients with opioid use disorder.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires each residential treatment facility licensed pursuant to <u>present law</u>, R.S. 40:2151 et seq., which provides treatment for opioid use disorder to provide all of the following:

- (1) Onsite access to at least one form of FDA-approved opioid agonist treatment.
- (2) Access to at least one form of FDA-approved opioid antagonist treatment either onsite or by referral.

<u>Proposed law</u> prohibits the La. Department of Health (LDH) from taking any action prior to Jan. 1, 2023, against a residential treatment facility licensed as of the effective date of <u>proposed law</u> for failure to comply with proposed law.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires LDH to develop a monitoring mechanism to track and report on which providers are complying with the requirements of <u>proposed law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires LDH to offer technical assistance to providers seeking to comply with the requirements of proposed law.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires each provider subject to <u>proposed law</u> to furnish to LDH a report on or before Jan. 1, 2021, which addresses its progress toward satisfying the requirements of <u>proposed law</u>.
