## HOUSE COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

2019 Regular Session

Substitute for Original House Bill No. 233 by Representative Wright as proposed by the House Committee on Commerce

## This document reflects the content of a substitute bill but is not in a bill form; page numbers in this document DO NOT correspond to page numbers in the substitute bill itself.

To amend and reenact R.S. 37:1864.3, relative to the transactions of secondhand dealers; to provide for precious metals; to provide for other metals; to remove restrictions relative to the buying and selling of precious metals and other metals by secondhand dealers; to provide for limitations; to provide for multiple transactions; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 37:1864.3 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

§1864.3. Payment by check for copper, or aluminum-copper air conditioning coils, precious metals, or other metals required; check cashing prohibited; penalties

A.(1) A secondhand dealer shall not enter into any cash transactions in payment for the purchase of copper or aluminum-copper air conditioning coils. Payment for copper or aluminum-copper air conditioning coils shall be made in the form of a check made payable to the seller of the copper or aluminum-copper air conditioning coils and mailed to the address recorded on the photo identification of the seller no earlier than five business days after the date of the transaction.

(2) A secondhand dealer shall not enter into any cash transactions in payment for the purchase of any precious metal object. Payment for a precious metal object shall be made in the form of a check made payable to the seller of the metal.

(3) A secondhand dealer shall not enter into any cash transactions in excess of three hundred dollars in payment for the purchase of metal property other than copper, aluminumcopper air conditioning coils, or a precious metal object. Payments in excess of three hundred dollars for metals other than copper, aluminum-copper air conditioning coils, or a precious metal object shall be made in the form of a check made payable to the name and address of the seller and may be tendered to the seller at the time of the transaction. secondhand dealer, at his discretion, may make payment by either cash or other method for transactions of three hundred dollars or less for all metals other than copper or aluminumcopper air conditioning coils, or a precious metal object.

B. All payments made by check shall be reported separately in the daily reports required by R.S. 37:1866.

C.(1) No secondhand dealer shall allow a seller to engage in multiple transactions within a twenty-four hour period totaling more than three hundred dollars for the purpose of circumventing this Section.

(2) No secondhand dealer shall cash, offer to cash, or provide the means for exchanging for cash a check issued to a seller pursuant to this Section on the premises of the secondhand dealer's place of business, including but not limited to the use of an automatic teller machine.

D. Violations of this Section shall be subject to the penalties provided for in R.S.

37:1869 and 1870.

Abstract: Removes restrictions relative to the buying and selling of precious metals and other metals by secondhand dealers.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits a secondhand dealer from entering into any cash transactions in payment for the purchase of any precious metal object.

Proposed law repeals present law.

<u>Present law</u> requires payment for a precious metal object to be made in the form of a check made payable to the seller of the metal.

Proposed law repeals present law.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits a secondhand dealer from entering into any cash transactions, in excess of \$300 in payment for the purchase of metal property other than copper, alumninum-copper air conditioning coils, or a precious metal object.

Proposed law repeals present law.

<u>Present law</u> requires payments in excess of \$300 for metals other than copper, aluminumcopper air conditioning coils, or a precious metal object to be made in the form of a check made payable to the name and address of the seller and allows the payment to be made to the seller at the time of the transaction.

Proposed law repeals present law.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits any secondhand dealer from allowing a seller to engage in multiple transactions within a 24-hour period totaling more than \$300 for the purposes of circumventing present law.

Proposed law repeals present law.
