PUBLIC RECORDS

Subject: Prohibits disclosure of certain personal information

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Prohibits disclosure of certain personal information in public records

Proposed law provides that **present law** pursuant to R.S. 44:1 et seq. - Public Records Law does not apply to the social security number, driver's license number, financial institution number, credit or debit card number, or armed forces identification of a private person who has submitted the information to a public body or official; provides for an exception with regard to records recorded in the mortgage or conveyance records, records of a court, or marriage records; provides that the public training program established by the attorney general with regard to the provisions of the Public Records Law also illustrate the possibility that information submitted to a public body may become public record; and requires that each custodian use reasonable means to notify the public that information submitted to the public body may become public record.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

Proposed law is not anticipated to create a material expenditure impact for any state entity or local governing body.

To estimate the potential impact of the provisions of **proposed law**, the LFO surveyed the Division of Administration, Louisiana Department of Health, Louisiana Department of Children and Family Services, the Louisiana Department of Public Safety and Corrections - Public Safety Services (DOC-PSS), the Secretary of State, the Attorney General, the Louisiana Municipal Association and the Louisiana Clerks of Court Association as representative large agencies or representatives organizations of public entities that possess access to large amounts of private citizen data. The general consensus among state and local agencies is that the provisions of proposed law are largely adhered to currently as a matter of practice, if not law. All respondents indicated that the provisions of **proposed law** can be accomplished with existing staff and budgetary resources. Responding agencies and representative organizations indicated that staff within the respective legal services offices will generally absorb the duties of ensuring relevant information is redacted from public records. The cost to add notice to the public that information submitted may become part of the public record is nominal, but could include revisions and reprinting of paper forms to include disclaimer language.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
