3	(1) "Applied behavior analysis provider" shall mean a provider who is
4	licensed by the Louisiana Behavior Analyst Board and is in good standing to provide
5	applied behavior analysis services.
6	(2) "Applied behavior analysis services" shall include the design,
7	implementation, and evaluation of systematic instructional and environmental
8	modifications by an applied behavior analysis provider to produce socially
9	significant improvements in behavior.
10	(1)(3) "Behavioral health evaluation" shall include but not be limited to the
11	following criteria:
12	(a) Diagnosis.
13	(b) Type of intervention.
14	(c) Length of intervention.
15	(d) Identification of a student's goals.
16	(e) Identification of impact of student behavior on a student's educational
17	program.
18	(f) Recommendations for applied behavior analysis services.
19	(2)(4) "Behavioral health provider" shall mean a provider who is licensed by
20	the Louisiana Department of Health or a health profession licensing board and is in
21	good standing to provide behavioral health services in Louisiana including but not
22	limited to a psychiatrist, psychologist, medical psychologist, licensed specialist in
23	school psychology, marriage and family therapist, professional counselor, clinical
24	social worker, applied behavior analysis provider, or a behavioral health provider
25	organization licensed to provide behavioral health services in Louisiana.
26	(3)(5) "Behavioral health services" shall include but not be limited to
27	individual psychotherapy, family psychotherapy, psychotropic medication
28	management, community psychiatric support and treatment, and crisis intervention,
29	and applied behavior analysis services.

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(4)(6) "Evaluator" shall mean a licensed psychiatrist, psychologist, medical
psychologist, licensed specialist in school psychology, professional counselor,
marriage and family therapist, or clinical social worker, or applied behavior analysis
provider who is certified by the respective board of examiners in Louisiana to
provide necessary evaluations and who is not an employee of the public school
governing authority or the state Department of Education.
C. Nothing in this Section shall be construed to supersede any of the
following:
(1) the The authority of a student's Individualized Education Program team
or Section 504 committee to determine appropriate services for a student pursuant
to applicable federal and state law.
(2) The provisions of the Behavioral Health Services Provider Licensing
Law or any regulation promulgated by the Louisiana Department of Health pursuant
to that law.
(3) The provisions of the Behavior Analysts Practice Act.

Abstract: Provides for student access to applied behavior analysis providers in schools.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits a public school governing authority from denying student access to behavioral health service providers at school during school hours if requested by the student's parent or legal guardian. Requires such governing authorities to adopt policies to implement <u>present law</u> that include requirements for providers relative to liability insurance coverage, criminal background checks, compliance with students' specific education, behavior, or health plans, reporting students' progress, submission of behavioral health evaluations by parents, and other specified matters. Defines "behavioral health service provider" and other terms for purposes of <u>present law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> adds "applied behavior analysis providers" to <u>present law</u> definition of "behavioral health service provider" in order to allow access to such providers for students in school upon the parent's request.

In addition, proposed law:

(1) Requires public school governing authorities to make their policies available to the public.

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(2) Provides that behavioral health evaluations include recommendations for applied behavior analysis services.

(3) Provides that <u>present law</u> and <u>proposed law</u> shall not supercede <u>present law</u> relative to the licensing of behavioral health services providers or any regulation of the La. Dept. of Health related thereto or <u>present law</u> relative to the practice of behavior analysts.

Proposed law otherwise retains present law.
