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SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 42

BY SENATOR APPEL AND REPRESENTATIVE BRASS

WORKFORCE COMMISSION. Postsecondary Education: Requests the Board of Regents to create the Work-Based Learning Task Force.

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To urge and request the Board of Regents to create the "Work-Based Learning Task Force" to engage industry, government, high schools, and postsecondary education institutions to undertake a national and statewide review of successful, high-value, work-based learning programs and projects; to establish a vision, goals, and targets for statewide impact; to develop a comprehensive, coordinated statewide framework and implementation plan for Louisiana; to identify policies and strategies designed to lead to the expansion, improvement, and better coordination of existing workbased learning initiatives in the state; and to make policy recommendations to the legislature for a large scale, coordinated work-based learning model in Louisiana. WHEREAS, Louisiana industry is grappling with a shortage of qualified, credentialed workers in growing fields such as healthcare, advanced manufacturing, and digital technology that provide family-supporting wages and career growth opportunities; and WHEREAS, Louisiana and nationwide employers recognize a gap between the education students receive in our high schools and postsecondary education institutions and the skills needed in the 21st century workplace; and

WHEREAS, in addition to specific knowledge and technical training, employers seek

1	workers who understand the culture and expectations of the workplace including strong
2	communication and problem-solving, among other essential skills; and
3	WHEREAS, Louisiana has one of the highest poverty rates in the country at more
4	than eighteen percent and many of those who live and raise children in poverty do not have
5	the work skills or credentials for employment in careers that provide a family-supporting
6	wage, and do not have the means or time to participate in postsecondary education and
7	training opportunities; and
8	WHEREAS, the state's unemployed and underemployed citizens are
9	disproportionally minorities; and
10	WHEREAS, for Louisiana's economy to grow, the state must ensure that citizens can
11	obtain skills and credentials that meet the needs of employers that provide living wages; and
12	WHEREAS, the state will not be able to meet its workforce needs, reduce poverty,
13	and improve the economic health of the state and its citizens without closing gaps for
14	minorities and impoverished communities; and
15	WHEREAS, work-based learning initiatives and programs that include wages,
16	college credit and industry recognized credentials, and on-the-job training are a proven
17	method for closing the gaps between worker skills and employer needs to help develop state
18	and local economies; and
19	WHEREAS, "earn and learn" models provide a financially viable path for students
20	and workers to and through postsecondary education opportunities, and provide
21	opportunities for business to upskill and retrain workers; and
22	WHEREAS, experiential or work-based learning opportunities are an effective way
23	to connect underserved populations to family-supporting careers; and
24	WHEREAS, a statewide framework for work-based learning opportunities that is
25	driven by industry and supported by education and workforce development policy and
26	practice in high schools and postsecondary education institutions will provide the foundation
27	for greater industry and education alignment to meet the workforce needs and economic
28	goals of the state.

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THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby

1	engage industry, government, high schools, and postsecondary education institutions to
2	undertake a national and statewide review of successful, high-value, work-based learning
3	programs and projects; to establish a vision, goals, and targets for statewide impact; to
4	develop a comprehensive, coordinated, statewide framework and implementation plan for
5	Louisiana; to identify policies and strategies designed to lead to the expansion, improvement,
6	and better coordination of existing work-based learning initiatives in the state; and to make
7	policy recommendations to the legislature for a large scale, coordinated work-based learning
8	model in Louisiana.
9	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall be composed of the
10	following:
11	(1) The commissioner of higher education, or his designee, who shall serve as chair.
12	(2) The state superintendent of education, or his designee.
13	(3) The president of each of the four public postsecondary education management
14	boards, or his designee.
15	(4) The president of Louisiana Association of Independent Colleges & Universities,
16	or his designee.
17	(5) The executive director of the Louisiana Association of School Superintendents,
18	or his designee.
19	(6) The executive director of the Louisiana School Boards Association, or his
20	designee.
21	(7) A current Louisiana high school student appointed by the state superintendent of
22	education.
23	(8) The president of the Council of Student Body Presidents, or his designee.
24	(9) The executive director of the Louisiana Workforce Commission, or his designee.
25	(10) The secretary of the Department of Economic Development, or his designee.
26	(11) The president of the Louisiana Association of Business and Industry, or his
27	designee.
28	(12) The state director of the National Federation of Independent Business, of his
29	designee.
30	(13) The president of the Louisiana American Federation of Labor & Congress of

Industrial Organizations, or his designee.

(14) The chair of the Senate Committee on Education, or his designee.

(15) The chair of the House Committee on Education, or his designee.

(16) Eight members representing the business and industry community appointed by the secretary of the Department of Economic Development from nominations submitted by the Louisiana Association of Chambers of Commerce Executives, the Committee of 100 for Economic Development, Inc., the state's regional economic development organizations, and the Louisiana Association of Business and Industry, half of whom must be currently engaged in work-based learning activities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a vacancy in task force membership shall be filled in the manner of the original appointment.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the commissioner of higher education, as chair, shall convene the task force for an organizational meeting not later August 15, 2019. The task force may select such other officers as deemed necessary. A majority of the total membership shall constitute a quorum and any official action taken by the task force shall require an affirmative vote of a majority of the quorum present and voting.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Regents shall provide staff support to the task force.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall determine a strategy and framework for recommendations to the legislature on all matters relevant to the implementation of work-based learning programs, which shall include the following:

- (1) A report that identifies and examines successful work-based learning programs nationally and within the state, including pertinent background material, data, an inventory of existing state and local programs and partnerships for work-based learning, and recognized best practices that may serve as models for a statewide work-based learning program in Louisiana.
 - (2) A policy agenda for the state's work-based learning initiative which shall include:
- (a) A comprehensive review of statewide laws and policies with the greatest potential impact on the successful creation and implementation of a statewide framework for valuable work-based learning models.

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(b) Identification of a statewide and regional framework for collaboration between high schools, postsecondary institutions, and industry that leverages existing programs, partnerships, and funding. (c) An intermediary model for the coordination and implementation of regional and statewide work-based learning efforts, common language defining valuable work-based learning experiences, and a plan and timeline to scale up. (d) Identification of methods and efforts to ensure access and equity to work-based learning opportunities for Louisiana's underserved populations. (e) A funding model to support and sustain valuable work-based learning programs that include college credit and/or industry-based credentials, on-the-job work for pay, and other related expenses, as well as the infrastructure required to implement these programs. (3) An implementation timeline. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that members of the task force shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for expenses incurred by their respective agency or organization. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Regents shall submit a written report of task force findings and recommendations to the legislature not later than February 1, 2020. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the chair of the Board of Regents and the commissioner of higher education.
