| 5 | of being the first Greek-letter sorority established by African American college women, was |
| 6 | founded at Howard University in Washington, D.C., in 1908; and |
| 7 | WHEREAS, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority's unending quest to be "Supreme in |
| 8 | Service to All Mankind" spans across domestic and international boundaries through the |
| 9 | service of members of more than one thousand chapters around the world; and |
| 10 | WHEREAS, the state of Louisiana hosts thirty-seven of these chapters on college and |
| 11 | university campuses and active alumnae groups throughout the state; and |
| 12 | WHEREAS, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated, is a union of nearly three |
| 13 | hundred thousand energetic, ambitious, and dedicated college-trained women who have |
| 14 | consciously chosen this affiliation as a means of service to promote community initiatives |
| 15 | in health preservation, preventative health education, academic excellence, civic |
| 16 | engagement, and economic empowerment; and |
| 17 | WHEREAS, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated, chapters encourage |
| 18 | members to become involved and committed community volunteers in five primary service |
| 19 | target areas that actively contribute to the educational, civic, and social lives of the citizens |

WHEREAS, AKA Day at the state capitol is a national program through which
Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority members throughout the nation meet with their legislators to
address issues that are pertinent to their communities; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate to commend the members of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated, for one hundred eleven years of exemplary leadership and outstanding community service, and to designate Wednesday, May 8, 2019, as AKA Day at the state capitol.
