**Abstract:** Authorizes the mayor's courts to collect fines, forfeitures, penalties, and costs and provides a means of payment for such fines, forfeitures, penalties, and costs.

<u>Present law</u> requires the clerk of city court or the marshal to collect all fines, forfeitures, penalties, and costs.

<u>Present law</u> requires all funds collected, except for costs, to be paid into the city treasury when the prosecution is on behalf of the city and into the parish treasury to be deposited in the parish general fund when the prosecution is on behalf of the state or parish.

<u>Present law</u> provides different methods for payment of fines and provides for a processing fee for certain transactions, which cannot exceed five percent of the amount of taxes and any penalties or interest paid.

<u>Present law</u> further provides that the fee shall be in addition to the amount of the fines, forfeitures, penalties, or costs.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds a provision that allows mayor's courts to collect fines, forfeitures, penalties, and costs. <u>Proposed law</u> also authorizes mayor's courts to accept such payments via credit card or electronic check, and to collect a processing fee consistent with <u>present</u> law.
