SENATE BILL NO. 129

BY SENATORS COLOMB, CORTEZ, HEWITT, LONG, PRICE AND GARY SMITH Prefiled pursuant to Article III, Section 2(A)(4)(b)(i) of the Constitution of Louisiana.

ROADS/HIGHWAYS. Requires a local municipal or parish authority to allow certain pedestrians to stand in a roadway to solicit charitable contributions under certain circumstances. (8/1/19)

1 AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 32:218, relative to pedestrians; to provide for the solicitation of charitable contributions for charitable or civic nonprofit organizations by certain pedestrians standing in a roadway; to provide relative to the regulation of charitable solicitations on public roadways by a local municipal or parish authority; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

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Section 1. R.S. 32:218 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

§218. Pedestrians soliciting rides or business

A. No Subject to Subsection B, no person shall stand on a public roadway for the purpose of soliciting a ride, employment, or business from the occupant of any vehicle.

B.(1) Subject to the permission of the municipality or parish governing local municipal or parish authority in which the roadway is located, a member of a professional firefighters association, a police officer, or other nonprofit organization public safety officer shall not be prohibited by this Section nor any other provision of state law from standing on a public roadway for the purpose of soliciting

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contributions, as a member of such association, on behalf of bona fide charitable or 2 civic organizations: during daylight hours, if all of the following are satisfied: (a) The charitable or civic organization complies with applicable local 3 government regulations. A local municipal or parish authority may enact or 4 5 enforce regulations that restrict, but shall not prohibit, the activity described in this Subsection. 6 7 (b) The charitable or civic organization maintains at least five hundred 8 thousand dollars in liability insurance. 9 (c) The person is eighteen years of age or older. 10 (d) The person is wearing high-visibility safety apparel that meets 11 current American standards promulgated by the International Safety 12 **Equipment Association.** 13 (e) The portion of the roadway upon which the solicitation occurs is not 14 a work zone and is within an intersection where traffic control devices are 15 present. 16 (2) A local municipal or parish authority with jurisdiction over a 17 roadway upon which solicitation occurs as described in this Subsection shall not be liable for any claim for damages arising out of the use of the roadway as 18 19 described in this Subsection. 20 (3) A person who violates this Subsection may be assessed a civil penalty. (4) As used in this Subsection, "charitable or civic organization" means 21 22 a nonprofit organization that is qualified under Section 501(c)(3) or 501(c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code, 26 U.S.C. 501, or a veteran's organization that 23 24 has tax-exempt status under the Internal Revenue Code. (5) A local municipal or parish authority that has enacted or is enforcing 25 regulations that are prohibited under this Subsection shall bring those 26 27 regulations into compliance with this Subsection no later than sixty days 28 following its effective date.

C. This Section shall be known as the Rivers Lacrouts Charitable

<u>Present law</u> prohibits persons from standing on a public roadway to solicit rides, employment, or business from occupants of vehicles.

<u>Present law</u> provides an exception allowing members of professional firefighters associations, or other nonprofit organizations to solicit contributions, as members of that association, on behalf of bona fide charitable organizations if granted permission to solicit by the municipal or parish governing authority.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds police officers and other public safety officers to pedestrians who shall not be prohibited by <u>present law</u> or any other provision of state law from standing on a public roadway for the purpose of soliciting contributions on behalf of bona fide charitable or civic organizations in daylight hours provided the following conditions are satisfied:

- (a) The charitable or civic organization complies with applicable local government regulations. A local municipal or parish authority may enact or enforce regulations that restrict, but shall not prohibit, the activity described in proposed law.
- (b) The charitable or civic organization maintains at least five hundred thousand dollars in liability insurance.
- (c) The person is eighteen years of age or older.
- (d) The person is wearing high-visibility safety apparel that meets current American standards promulgated by the International Safety Equipment Association.
- (e) The portion of the roadway upon which the solicitation occurs is not a work zone and is within an intersection where traffic control devices are present.

<u>Proposed law</u> limits liability for damages of a local municipal or parish authority with jurisdiction over a roadway upon which solicitation occurs as described in proposed law.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes assessment of a civil penalty on a person who violates the provisions of <u>proposed law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "charitable or civic organization" as a nonprofit organization that is qualified under Section 501(c)(3) or 501(c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code, 26 U.S.C. 501, or a veteran's organization that has tax-exempt status under the Internal Revenue Code.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires a local municipal or parish authority that has enacted or is enforcing regulations that are prohibited under <u>proposed law</u> to bring those regulations into compliance with <u>proposed law</u> no later than 60 days following its effective date.

<u>Proposed law</u> adds that it shall be known as the Rivers Lacrouts Charitable Solicitation Act.

Effective August 1, 2019.
