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HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 48

HEALTH CARE/FACILITIES: Requests a study concerning the potential use of monitoring devices in the rooms of residents of intermediate care facilities for people with developmental disabilities

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2	To urge and request the Louisiana Department of Health to study the feasibility and
3	desirability of implementing a policy to allow the use of monitoring devices in the
4	rooms of residents of intermediate care facilities for people with developmental
5	disabilities, and to report findings of the study to the legislative committees on health
6	and welfare.
7	WHEREAS, intermediate care facilities for people with developmental disabilities,
8	referred to hereafter as "ICF/DD", are facilities that provide services to individuals with
9	developmental or intellectual disabilities who require twenty-four hours of care per day in
10	community, group, or residential home settings; and
11	WHEREAS, ICF/DDs are licensed and regulated by the Louisiana Department of
12	Health in accordance with the provisions of R.S. 40:2180 et seq.; and
13	WHEREAS, ensuring the health and safety of ICF/DD residents is a vitally important
14	duty of this state; and
15	WHEREAS, Louisiana law, R.S. 40:1193.1 et seq., authorizes the use of monitoring
16	devices, subject to certain conditions and requirements, in the rooms of residents of other
17	types of institutional facilities in which vulnerable populations receive care; however, the
18	use of such devices in the ICF/DDs of this state is not yet authorized in statute or rule.
19	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
20	urge and request the Louisiana Department of Health to study the feasibility and desirability

- 2 of intermediate care facilities for people with developmental disabilities.
- 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in developing the study called for in this
- 4 Resolution, the department shall engage, collaborate with, and obtain information and
- 5 perspective from stakeholder organizations including, without limitation, the governor's
- 6 office of disability affairs and the Louisiana Developmental Disabilities Council.
- 7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the department shall submit a written report of
- 8 its findings resulting from the study requested in this Resolution to the House Committee
- 9 on Health and Welfare and the Senate Committee on Health and Welfare on or before March
- 10 31, 2020.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the
- secretary of the Louisiana Department of Health, the executive director of the governor's
- office of disability affairs, and the executive director of the Louisiana Developmental
- 14 Disabilities Council.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Health and Welfare</u> to the original bill:

1. Change the due date for the report requested by the Resolution <u>from</u> on or before Dec. 31, 2019 <u>to</u> on or before March 31, 2020.
