PURCHASING/PROCUREMT CD: Creates the State Use Council for the Purchase of Goods and Services Provided by Individuals with Disabilities and institutes "supported employment provider" in laws on public procurement, public contracts, taxation, and work release programs

R.S. 15:711(B) and 1111(B) are hereby amended and reenacted to read 12 as follows: §711. Work release program 13 14 15 B. Each sheriff shall establish written rules for the administration of the work 16 release program and shall determine those inmates who may participate in the release 17 program, except that no inmate may participate in the program if his sentence so

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stipulates. Inmates sentenced to the Department of Corrections who are in the custody of the sheriff shall not be eligible for work release unless such inmates are in compliance with standards for work release within the department and written approval of the secretary of the department is obtained. If any inmate violates the conditions prescribed by the sheriff, his work release privileges may be withdrawn. Failure to report to or return from the planned employment shall be considered an escape under the provisions of R.S. 14:110. The sheriff may approve as work release privileges, placement in universities, colleges, technical, vocational or trade schools or in sheltered workshops or supported employment providers as defined in R.S. 39:1604.4, or in training programs designed to improve the skills and abilities of the inmate.

Any inmate sentenced to imprisonment at hard labor shall be eligible at any time during his sentence to participate in the work release program, subject to the provisions of this Part. If any inmate violates the conditions prescribed by the department, his work release privileges may be withdrawn. Failure to report to or return from the planned employment shall be considered an escape under the provisions of R.S. 14:110. The department may approve as work release privileges, placement in universities, colleges, technical, vocational or trade schools, or in sheltered workshops or supported employment providers as defined in R.S. 39:1604.4, or in training programs designed to improve the skills and abilities of the inmate.

Abstract: Creates the State Use Council for the Purchase of Goods and Services Provided by Individuals with Disabilities for the coordination and facilitation of purchases of goods manufactured and services performed by individuals with disabilities through a supported employment provider.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the preference of goods manufactured or services performed by individuals with severe disabilities in state-operated and state-supported sheltered workshops, establishes the exemption from competitive bidding requirements, and provides for certain definitions. <u>Present law</u> further provides for the creation of a council by the La. Department of Health (LDH) whose membership is determined by the secretary of LDH to coordinate and facilitate the provisions of <u>present law</u>, and provides the council with authority to designate and contract with a central nonprofit agency.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but changes the preference <u>from</u> individuals with severe disabilities <u>to</u> individuals with disabilities through supported employment providers. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> for exemptions from the competitive bidding requirement provided the goods and services are equal in quality and reasonable in the rate charged based on goods and services available from other providers.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but renames the council the "State Use Council for the Purchase of Goods and Services Provided by Individuals with Disabilities" and provides for the council to solicit and evaluate competitive sealed proposals at least every five years to designate and contract with a central nonprofit agency.

<u>Proposed law</u> adds definitions for "individuals with disabilities" and "supported employment provider" and repeals certain definitions. <u>Proposed law</u> provides for "supporting employment provider" to include "sheltered workshops" transitioning into a "supporting employment provider" for fiscal years 2019-2020 and 2020-2021.

<u>Present law</u> provides for sheriffs to place inmates in work release programs including in sheltered workshops, and provides for tax credits and exemptions for sheltered workshops.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds "supported employment providers" throughout present law.

Effective July 1, 2019.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Appropriations</u> to the <u>original</u> bill:

1. Technical correction to reinstate "sheltered workshops" to <u>present law</u> for work release programs, job credits, and tax exemptions.

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The House Floor Amendments to the engrossed bill:

- 1. Make technical corrections.
- 2. Add sensory to the list of disabilities.
- 3. Change the percentage of man-hours of direct labor <u>from 25% to 40%</u> in the definition of "goods manufactured and services performed by individuals with disabilities".
- 4. Change the definition of "supported employment provider" to include nonprofit organizations, programs or entities in compliance with a central nonprofit agency for individuals with disabilities.
- 5. Repeal provisions regarding the sheltered industries program for individuals who are blind.
