



1           WHEREAS, to protect the integrity of its own information systems and networks,  
2 the state must be assured that vendors with which it does business take the necessary steps  
3 to do the same; and

4           WHEREAS, the Cybersecurity Enhancement Act of 2014 formalized the role of the  
5 National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) and empowered the United States  
6 secretary of commerce, through the director of NIST, to develop a voluntary Cybersecurity  
7 Framework; and

8           WHEREAS, in 2014, the NIST drafted a Cybersecurity Framework which provides  
9 a policy framework of computer security consisting of standards, guidelines, and best  
10 practices to manage cybersecurity-related risks by focusing on five core functions: identify,  
11 protect, detect, respond, and recover; and

12           WHEREAS, the Cybersecurity Framework further includes a self-assessment tool  
13 for businesses to use to discover vulnerabilities and prioritize cybersecurity objectives; and

14           WHEREAS, the Cybersecurity Framework was drafted in plain language to enable  
15 it to be a more cost-effective protocol; and

16           WHEREAS, many businesses are either unaware of cybersecurity risks or of the  
17 benefits of the NIST Cybersecurity Framework, or both; and

18           WHEREAS, businesses that are aware of cybersecurity risks often fear the cost of  
19 implementing the Cybersecurity Framework, placing both the business and its partners at  
20 risk; and

21           WHEREAS, the use of the Cybersecurity Framework is not presently mandated as  
22 private businesses and industry may require financial incentive for its adoption and use.

23           THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby  
24 urge and request the Department of Economic Development, in cooperation with the  
25 Louisiana Association of Business and Industry, to create a task force to study and conduct  
26 a beta test that is composed of volunteer representatives from private businesses that are  
27 domiciled and licensed to conduct business in the state of Louisiana, and to determine the  
28 cost, resources, and time required for varying sizes of businesses to adhere to the  
29 Cybersecurity Framework Standards promulgated by the National Institute of Standards and  
30 Technology.

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall be composed of the  
2 following members:

3 (1) The chairman of the House Committee on Commerce or his designee.

4 (2) The chairman of the Senate Committee on Commerce, Consumer Protection, and  
5 International Affairs or his designee.

6 (3) The chairman of the House Committee on Ways and Means or his designee.

7 (4) The chairman of the Senate Committee on Revenue and Fiscal Affairs or his  
8 designee.

9 (5) The executive director of the Stephenson Disaster Management Institute of  
10 Louisiana State University or his designee.

11 (6) The president of the Louisiana Association of Business and Industry or his  
12 designee.

13 (7) The director of the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency  
14 Preparedness or his designee.

15 (8) The director of the Louisiana State Analytical and Fusion Exchange or his  
16 designee.

17 (9) The director of business intelligence at Louisiana Economic Development.

18 (10) A representative from the Louisiana Business Emergency Operations Center,  
19 appointed by the director of the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency  
20 Preparedness, or his designee.

21 (11) The president of the Louisiana Chemical Association or his designee.

22 (12) The president of the Louisiana Mid-Continent Oil and Gas Association or his  
23 designee.

24 (13) The president of the Baton Rouge Area Chamber or his designee.

25 (14) The executive director of the Cyber Innovation Center or his designee.

26 (15) The director of the Louisiana Small Business Development Center or his  
27 designee.

28 (16) The chief executive officer of LCTA-The Internet & Television Association or  
29 his designee.

1           (17) The chairman of the Louisiana Telecommunications Association or his  
2 designee.

3           BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the director of business intelligence at the  
4 Department of Economic Development and the president of the Louisiana Association of  
5 Business and Industry shall be jointly responsible for designating, delegating, and managing  
6 the duties of the task force, and shall convene the first meeting of the task force no later than  
7 August 1, 2019, at which time the task force shall adopt rules of procedure, a work and  
8 planning schedule, and develop any additional measures that it deems necessary for the  
9 timely performance of its duties, including the selection of officers.

10           BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force conduct a beta test, determine the  
11 cost, resources, and time required for businesses to adhere to the Cybersecurity Framework  
12 Standards, and provide a written report of its findings and recommendations, and a proposed  
13 budget including a financial incentive plan to the House Committee on Commerce; the  
14 Senate Committee on Commerce, Consumer Protection, and International Affairs; the House  
15 Committee on Ways and Means; and the Senate Committee on Revenue and Fiscal Affairs  
16 no later than January 10, 2020.

17           BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the  
18 entities named in this Resolution to serve or be represented on the task force.

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Requests the Dept. of Economic Development, with the La. Assoc. of Business and Industry, to create a task force to study and conduct a beta test of the Cybersecurity Framework Standards promulgated by the National Institute of Standards and Technology and to provide a written report of its findings and recommendations to the House Committee on Commerce; the Senate Committee on Commerce, Consumer Protection, and International Affairs; the House Committee on Ways and Means; and the Senate Committee on Revenue and Fiscal Affairs no later than Jan. 10, 2020.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by House Committee on Commerce to the original concurrent resolution:

1. Add two representatives to the task force: the chief executive officer of LCTA-The Internet & Television Association or his designee and the chairman of the Louisiana Telecommunications Association or his designee.

The Committee Amendments Proposed by House Committee on House and Governmental Affairs to the engrossed concurrent resolution:

1. Provide that each chairman of the specified legislative committees may have a designee serve on the task force in his place.
2. Change the report date from no later than 60 days prior to the 2020 R.S. to no later than Jan. 10, 2020.
3. Make technical changes.
