HB 141 2019 Regular Session Howard

LAW ENFORCE/OFFICERS: Provides relative to motorcyclist profiling training for peace officers

Synopsis of Senate Amendments

- 1. Makes technical changes.
- 2. Amends the definition of "peace officer" to include security personnel employed by a court of appeal of the state of La.
- 3. Prohibits security personnel of any court of appeal of the state from receiving supplemental pay benefits regardless of whether the security personnel completed a council-approved training program.
- 4. Provides that the commission issued to court security personnel shall remain in force and in effect at the pleasure of the employing court.
- 5. Removes past dates, provided in <u>present law</u>, by which the council was required to implement certain programs.

Digest of Bill as Finally Passed by Senate

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the Council on Peace Officer Standards and Training to add motorcyclist profiling awareness training to the current bias recognition policing curriculum.

Proposed law defines "motorcyclist profiling" for purposes of this training.

<u>Proposed law</u> adds security personnel employed by a court of appeal to the list of peace officers required to participate in the training.

Present law provides for supplemental pay for peace officers who complete the training.

<u>Present law</u> provides that certified security personnel of the La. Supreme Court shall not be eligible to receive supplemental pay benefits even though the peace office has successfully completed a council-approved training program.

<u>Proposed law</u> also prohibits security personnel of courts of appeal from receiving supplemental pay benefits.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the commission issued to court security personnel shall remain in force and in effect at the pleasure of the employing court.
