SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 270

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CONGRESS. Memorializes Congress to approve the United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement in order to improve opportunities for U.S. farmers and small businesses, increase domestic manufacturing, and promote higher wages for workers here at home.

A RESOLUTION

| 4 | States agriculture industry and small businesses, increase domestic manufacturing, |
| 5 | and promote higher wages here at home. |
| 6 | WHEREAS, on September 30, 2018, the United States, Mexico, and Canada reached |
| 7 | an agreement to make much needed changes to the twenty-four-year-old North America Free |
| 8 | Trade Agreement (NAFTA); and |
| 9 | WHEREAS, the new United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA) will |
| 10 | advance United States agricultural interests in the most important markets for America's |
| 11 | farmers, ranchers, and agribusinesses, and this high-standard trade agreement opens new |
| 12 | markets to expand United States food and agricultural exports and support food |
| 13 | manufacturing and rural jobs; and |
| 14 | WHEREAS, one of the top priorities for the USMCA is to support America's dairy |
| 15 | industry in this negotiation so Canada would eliminate its program that allows low-priced |
| 16 | dairy ingredients to undersell United States dairy sales in Canada and in third country |
| 17 | markets; and |
| 18 | WHEREAS, the United States recognizes the fundamental role of small- and |

1 medium-sized businesses as economic engines of the North American economy and, for the 2 first time in a U.S. trade agreement, the USMCA includes a dedicated chapter and key 3 provisions supporting small- and medium-sized businesses throughout the agreement; and 4 WHEREAS, the proposed trade deal encourages United States manufacturing and regional economic growth; and 5 6 WHEREAS, the USMCA is beneficial to American workers because the greater 7 number of manufacturing jobs equals higher wages for American workers; and 8 WHEREAS, trade among our North American trading partners is made up 9 predominantly of intellectual property-intensive goods and services that employ millions of 10 Americans in high paying jobs and which generate billions of dollars in economic output; 11 and 12 WHEREAS, many of the intellectual property-intensive goods, services, and 13 exchanges through which trade is facilitated in the NAFTA bloc did not exist when the 14 agreement was drafted, which has resulted in uneven and weak intellectual property 15 enforcement; and 16 WHEREAS, stringent enforcement of intellectual property rights has been found to correlate closely with greater household income, foreign direct investment, and gross 17 18 domestic product; and 19 WHEREAS the intellectual property provisions found in the United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement are the most comprehensive of any multilateral United States trade 20 21 agreement ever negotiated and are vastly superior to those included in NAFTA. THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby 22 23 memorialize the United States Congress to take such actions as are necessary to approve the 24 United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement in order to promote the United States agriculture 25 industry and small businesses, increase domestic manufacturing, and promote higher wages here at home. 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States, the members of the United States Senate Committee on 28 29 Finance, the members of the United States House Committee on Ways and Means, the

members of the Senate and House Advisory Groups on Negotiations, the presiding officers

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of the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Congress of the United States of
