Keyword and oneliner of the instrument as it left the House

LOCAL EMPLOYEES: Provides with respect to employment applications with political subdivisions

Report adopts Senate amendments to:

1. Remove specific statement that <u>proposed law</u> does not preclude consideration of the arrest record in an employment decision.

Report rejects Senate amendments which would have:

- 1. Added provisions regarding the legislative auditor's review of cost recovery budget requests to determine if fees are adequate.
- 2. Added provision making the bill effective if another bill becomes effective.

Digest of the bill as proposed by the Conference Committee

<u>Proposed law</u> prohibits a political subdivision, when filling an employment position, from inquiring about a prospective employee's arrest record on the initial application form.

<u>Proposed law</u> does not prohibit a political subdivision from inquiring about a prospective employee's other criminal history on an initial application form.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that employment positions for which a background check is required by law are excepted from proposed law.
