JUDGES: (Constitutional Amendment) Provides relative to the mandatory retirement age for judges

1	A JOINT RESOLUTION	
2	Proposing to amend Article V, Section 23 of the Constitution of Louisiana, relative to public	
3	office and public employment; to provide for the elimination of the mandatory	
4	retirement age for judges; to provide for submission of the proposed amendment to	
5	the electors; and to provide for related matters.	
6	Section 1. Be it resolved by the Legislature of Louisiana, two-thirds of the members	
7	elected to each house concurring, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the state of	
8	Louisiana, for their approval or rejection in the manner provided by law, a proposal to	
9	amend Article V, Section 23 of the Constitution of Louisiana, to read as follows:	
10	§23. Judges; Retirement	
11	Section 23.(A) Retirement System. Within two years after the effective date	
12	of this constitution, the legislature shall provide for a retirement system for judges	
13	which shall apply to a judge taking office after the effective date of the law enacting	
14	the system and in which a judge in office at that time may elect to become a member,	
15	with credit for all prior years of judicial service and without contribution therefor.	
16	The retirement benefits and judicial service rights of a judge in office or retired on	
17	the effective date of this constitution shall not be diminished, nor shall the benefit	
18	to which a surviving spouse is entitled be reduced.	
19	(B) Mandatory Retirement. Except as otherwise provided in this Section, a	
20	judge shall not remain in office beyond his seventieth birthday. A judge who attains

1	seventy years of age while serving a term of office shall be allowed to complete that		
2	term of office.		
3	Section 2. Be it further resolved that this proposed amendment shall be submitted		
4	to the electors of the state of Louisiana at the statewide election to be held on November 3		
5	2020.		
6	Section 3. Be it further resolved that on the official ballot to be used at the election,		
7	there shall be printed a proposition, upon which the electors of the state shall be permitted		
8	to vote YES or NO, to amend the Constitution of Louisiana, which proposition shall read as		
9	follows:		
10	Do you support an amendment to remove the mandatory retirement age for		
11	judges? (Effective January 1, 2021) (Amends Article V, Section 23)

Abstract: Eliminates the mandatory retirement age requirement for all judges.

<u>Present constitution</u> requires that no judge may remain in office beyond his 70th birthday, but allows a judge to complete the current term if he attains 70 years of age while in office.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> repeals the mandatory retirement age of judges.

Provides for submission of the proposed amendment to the voters at the statewide election to be held Nov. 3, 2020.
