**Abstract:** Exempts local governments from the prohibition on naming public buildings after living persons.

Present law prohibits the naming of a public building or certain other public facilities owned by the state, by a local government, or by an institution receiving support from the state in honor of a living person.

Proposed constitutional amendment (HB \_\_\_\_ ) authorizes the governing authority of a local government to name a building or facility it owns after any living or deceased person.

Proposed law exempts local governments from the prohibition in present law.

Effective if and when the proposed amendment of Article VI of the Constitution of La. contained in the Act which originated as House Bill No. \_\_\_ of this 2020 R.S. of the Legislature is adopted at a statewide election and becomes effective.
