2	To amend and reenact Code of Criminal Procedure Article 701(B)(1)(a), relative to the time
3	period for filing a bill of information or indictment; to decrease the time period
4	within which an indictment or bill of information shall be filed under certain
5	circumstances; and to provide for related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. Code of Criminal Procedure Article 701(B)(1)(a) is hereby amended and
8	reenacted to read as follows:
9	Art. 701. Right to a speedy trial

11	B. The time period for filing a bill of information or indictment after arrest
12	shall be as follows:
13	(1)(a) When the defendant is continued in custody subsequent to an arrest,
14	an indictment or information shall be filed within forty-five seven days of the arrest
15	if the defendant is being held for a misdemeanor and within sixty fourteen days of
16	the arrest if the defendant is being held for a felony.

Abstract: Decreases the time period within which an indictment or bill of information shall be filed when the defendant is continued in custody subsequent to an arrest from 60 days to 14 days for felonies and from 45 days to 7 days for misdemeanors.

<u>Present law</u> provides that when the defendant is continued in custody subsequent to an arrest, an indictment or bill of information shall be filed within 45 days of the arrest if the defendant is being held for a misdemeanor and within 60 days of the arrest if the defendant is being held for a felony.

<u>Proposed law</u> amends <u>present law</u> to decrease the time period within which an indictment or bill of information shall be filed when the defendant is continued in custody subsequent to an arrest from 60 days to 14 days for felonies and from 45 days to 7 days for misdemeanors.

(Amends C.Cr.P. Art. 701(B)(1)(a))
