2	To amend and reenact R.S. 32:1(4.1) through (4.4), (38), (40), (41), (64.1), and (92),
3	76.1(B), 201(A), 401(17), (19), and (20), 851(5), 1252(1) and (30), and R.S.
4	47:301(17), and to enact R.S. 32:1(17.1) and 195.1, relative to electric bicycles; to
5	provide relative to classifications of electric bicycles; to provide relative to
6	limitations on passing bicycles; to provide relative to riding an electrical bicycle; to
7	provide for definitions and terms; and to provide for related matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S. 32:1(4.1) through (4.4), (38), (40), (41), (64.1), and (92), 76.1(B),
10	201(A), 401(17), (19), and (20), 851(5), 1252 (1) and (30) are hereby amended and reenacted
11	and R.S. 32:1(17.1) and 195.1 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
12	§1. Definitions
13	When used in this Chapter, the following words and phrases have the meanings
14	ascribed to them in this Section, unless the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

16	(4.1) "Bicycle facility" means any physical facility provided for the exclusive or
17	semi-exclusive use of bicycles or electric bicycles. This includes but is not limited to

unmarked shared roadways, marked shared roadways, bicycle lanes, shared use trails, and end of trip facilities.

3 (4.2) "Bicycle lane" means the part of the roadway adjacent to the travel lane, 4 designated by official signs or markings for the preferential or exclusive use by bicycles, 5 electric bicycles, and electric mobility aid users.

(4.3) "Bicycle parking" means any facility for the storage of bicycles or electric 7 bicycles to protect against theft and damage.

8 (4.4) "Bicycle path or trail" means a public way separated by open space, grade, or 9 other physical barrier from motor traffic, either within the highway right-of-way or within 10 an independent right-of-way, that is designated for use by persons riding bicycles or electric 11 bicycles.

13 (17.1) "Electric bicycle" shall mean a bicycle equipped with fully operable 14 pedals, a saddle or seat for the rider, and an electric motor of less than seven hundred fifty watts that meets the requirements of one of the following three classes: 15

16 (a) "Class 1 electric bicycle" shall mean an electric bicycle equipped with a motor that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling, and that ceases to 17 18 provide assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of twenty miles per hour.

19 (b) "Class 2 electric bicycle" shall mean an electric bicycle equipped with a 20 motor that may be used exclusively to propel the bicycle, and that is not capable of 21 providing assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of twenty miles per hour.

22 (c) "Class 3 electric bicycle" shall mean an electric bicycle equipped with a motor that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling, and that ceases to 23 24 provide assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of twenty miles per hour.

(38) "Motorcycle" means every motor vehicle having a seat or saddle for the use of 26 27 the rider and designed to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground, 28 but excluding a tractor and excluding a <u>an electric bicycle or</u> motorized bicycle.

19	(92) "Vehicle" means every device by which persons or things may be transported			
20	upon a public highway or bridge, except devices moved by human power or used exclusively			
21	upon stationary rails or tracks. A bicycle, electric bicycle, or a ridden animal shall be a			
22	vehicle, and a trailer or semitrailer shall be a separate vehicle.

26	B. The operator of a motor vehicle, when overtaking and passing a bicycle			
27	or electric bicycle proceeding in the same direction on the roadway, shall exercise			
28	due care while the motor vehicle is passing the bicycle and shall leave a safe distance

6	A. Except as provided in this Section, an electric bicycle or an operator	
7	of an electric bicycle shall be afforded all the rights and privileges and b	
8	subject to all of the duties of a bicycle or the operator of a bicycle. An electric	
9	bicycle is a vehicle to the same extent as a bicycle.	
10	B. An electric bicycle or a person operating an electric bicycle is not	
11	subject to the provisions of this Title relating to financial responsibility, driver's	
12	licenses, vehicle licenses, license plates, registration, certificates of titles, all-	
13	terrain vehicles, and off-road vehicles.	
14	C. Beginning January 1, 2021, manufacturers and distributors of electric	
15	bicycles shall apply a label that is permanently affixed in a prominent location	
16	to each bicycle. The label shall contain the classification number, top assisted	
17	speed, and motor wattage of the electric bicycle, and shall be printed in Arial

24	manufacturing requirement for bicycles adopted by the United States	
25	Consumer Product Safety Commission (16 CFR Part 1512).	
26	F. An electric bicycle shall operate in a manner so that the electric motor	
27	is disengaged or ceases to function when the rider stops pedaling or when the	
28	brakes are applied.

19	bicycle. A person under the age of sixteen may ride as a passenger on a Class 3	
20	electric bicycle that is designed to accommodate passengers.	
21	I. All operators and passengers of Class 3 electric bicycles shall wear a	
22	properly fitted and fastened approved helmet.	
23	(1) For the purpose of this Subsection, "approved helmet" shall have the	
24	same meaning as provided in R.S. 32:199.	
25	(2) The issuance of a citation for a violation of this Section shall not be	
26	prima facie evidence of negligence. The comparative negligence statuses of	
27	Louisiana shall apply in these cases as in all other cases of negligence.

14	The following words, terms, and phrases, when used in this Chapter, shall have the
15	meanings respectively ascribed to them in this Section, except where the context clearly

17	(1) "All-terrain vehicle" shall mean any vehicle manufactured for off-road use and
18	issued a manufacturer's statement or certificate of origin, as required by the commission, that
19	cannot be issued a registration certificate and license to operate on the public roads of this
20	state because, at the time of manufacture, the vehicle does not meet the safety requirements
21	prescribed by R.S. 32:1301 through 1310. This includes vehicles that are issued a title by the
22	Department of Public Safety and Corrections, public safety services, such as recreational and
23	sports vehicles, but it shall not include off-road vehicles used for farm purposes, farm
24	equipment, electric bicycle, or heavy construction equipment.

26	(30) "Motorcycle" means a motor vehicle having a seat or saddle for the use of the
27	rider and designed to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground but
28	excluding a tractor, electric bicycle, and electric-powered scooters not required to be

7	(17) "Off-road vehicle" is any vehicle manufactured for off-road use which is issued
8	a manufacturer's statement of origin that cannot be issued a registration certificate and
9	license to operate on the public roads of this state because at the time of manufacture the
10	vehicle does not meet the safety requirements prescribed by R.S. 32:1301 through 1310. This
11	includes vehicles that are issued a title only by the Department of Public Safety and
12	Corrections, public safety services, such as all terrain vehicles and recreational and sport
13	vehicles, but it shall not include off-road vehicles used for farm purposes, farm equipment,
14	electric bicycles, or heavy construction equipment.

16	Section 3. This Act shall become effective on August 1, 2020.

Present law (R.S. 32:1) provides for definitions.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and defines electronic bicycle as a bicycle equipped with fully operable pedals, seat and electrical motor of less than 700 watts.

Proposed law provides for classification of electric bicycles:

- (1) Class 1 electric bicycle is equipped with a motor that provides assistance only when rider is pedaling and no longer provides assistance up to 20 mph.
- (2) Class 2 electric bicycle is equipped with a motor that can propel the bicycle without pedaling, and the motor is not capable of providing assistance when the bicycle reaches 20 mph.
- (3) Class 3 electric bicycle is equipped with a motor that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling, and that no longer provides assistance when the bicycle reaches 28 mph.

Present law (R.S. 32:76.1) provides for limitations on passing bicycles.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and provides that the same limitations shall be taking by motorist when passing electronic bicycles.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that an operator of an electric bicycle shall be provided the same rights and privileges as the operator of a bicycle. Provides that operators of electric bicycles are not responsible for driver's license, vehicle license, license plates, registration, certificates of titles as all-terrain vehicles and off-road vehicles.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that a manufacturer and distributor of electric bicycles shall apply a label showing the classification, top assisted speed, and motor wattage of the electronic bicycle.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that no electronic bicycle shall be modified to change motor speed, unless a label indicates the classification is replaced. Further provides that an electronic bicycle shall comply with the United State Consumer Product Safety Commission.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that all electronic bicycles may be ridden in places where bicycles are allowed.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that local municipal authorities, local parish authorities, and state agencies can regulate bicycle trails or paths and restrict the use of electronic bicycles.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that no person under the age of 16 may operate a Class 3 electric bicycle. Further provides that all operators and passengers of a Class 3 electric bicycle shall wear an approved helmet.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for the issuance of a citation for failure to wear an approved helmet while operating a Class 3 bicycle cost associated with citation.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 32:201) provides that it shall be unlawful to harass, taunt, or throw objects at or in the direction of a bicycle.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and provides that it shall be unlawful to harass, taunt, or throw an object at or in the direction of an electronic bicycle.

Present law (R.S. 32: 401) provides for definitions of motorcycle, motorized bicycle, and motor vehicle.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and excludes electronic bicycle from the definition of motorcycle, motorized bicycle, and motor vehicle.

Present law (R.S. 32:851) provides for definition of motor vehicle.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and excludes electric bicycle from the definition of motor vehicle.

Present law (R.S. 32:1252) provides for definitions of all-terrain vehicle and motorcycle.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and excludes electric bicycle from the definition of all-terrain vehicle and motorcycle.

Present law (R.S. 47:301) provides for definition of off-road vehicle.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and excludes electric bicycle from the definition of off-road vehicle.
