Smith

<u>Present law</u> provides that a candidate in a primary election may withdraw by filing notice with the secretary of state prior to 4:30 p.m. on the seventh day after the close of the qualifying period.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that a candidate in a primary election may withdraw by filing notice with the secretary of state prior to 4:30 p.m. no later than the fifth day prior to the first day of early voting.

<u>Present law</u> provides that a candidate in a general election may withdraw by filing notice with the secretary of state prior to 4:30 p.m. on the ninth day after the date of the primary election.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that a candidate in a general election may withdraw by filing notice with the secretary of state prior to 4:30 p.m. no later than the fifth day prior to the first day of early voting.

<u>Present law</u> provides that election materials will be furnished at least 22 days before a primary election and as soon as possible for a general election.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that election materials will be furnished no earlier than four days prior to the first day of early voting.

Effective July 1, 2020.
