Abstract: Requires each early learning center to provide for the installation and operation of cameras that record both video and audio as a condition of licensure by the state Dept. of Education.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the licensure of early learning centers by the state Dept. of Education (DOE) and requires a center to be licensed in order to operate. <u>Proposed law</u> requires each early learning center to provide for the installation and operation of cameras that record both video and audio and provides that compliance with proposed law is a condition of its licensure.

<u>Proposed law</u> further requires the director of each early learning center to develop and share with all center employees and parents a policy relative to cameras that, at minimum, provides for the following:

- (1) The location and placement of cameras, including a prohibition against the recording of the interior of a restroom or any other area in which a child's clothing may be changed or removed.
- (2) A requirement that written notice of the cameras be provided to teachers and other employees, parents, and authorized visitors.
- (3) A requirement that all teachers and other employees who provide services at the early learning center receive training concerning proposed law.
- (4) Provisions relative to the duration of the retention of the video and audio data recorded and procedures for data storage and disposal.
- (5) Procedures for protecting children's privacy and for determining to whom and under what circumstances the data may be disclosed.
- (6) A requirement that cameras be in compliance with the National Fire Protection Association Life Safety Code.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that recordings shall be kept confidential and are not public records.
