Existing law (Const. Art. VII, \$20(A)(7)) provides that no homestead exemption shall be granted on bond for deed property.

Prior law (C.C. Art. 477(B)) provided that the buyer under a bond for deed contract was the owner of the thing for purposes of the homestead exemption.

<u>New law</u> repeals <u>prior law</u> (C.C. Art. 477(B)) as unconstitutional in light of Const. Art. VII, \$20(A)(7).

<u>Prior law</u> (R.S. 9:2948) deems a buyer in a bond for deed contract the owner of the property for purposes of the homestead exemption only.

<u>New law</u> repeals <u>prior law</u> (R.S. 9:2948) in light of Const. Art. VII, §20(A)(7) and the court's ruling in *Wooden v. Louisiana Tax Commission*, 650 So. 2d 1157 (La. 1995).
