Amendments proposed by House Committee on House and Governmental Affairs to Original House Bill No. 15 by Representative Frieman

1 AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, delete lines 15 through 20 and on page 2, delete lines 1 through 8 and insert the
following:

4 "(2)(a) The Either house of the legislature, by petition signed by a majority 5 of the surviving members of either that house, may terminate a the entire state of 6 disaster or emergency or any section or subsection of the executive order or 7 proclamation declaring the state of disaster or emergency at any time. This petition 8 terminating the state of emergency or disaster or any section or subsection of the 9 executive order or proclamation declaring the state of disaster or emergency may 10 establish a period during which no other declaration of emergency or disaster related to the state of disaster or emergency that was terminated or related to any section or 11 subsection of the executive order or proclamation declaring the state of disaster or 12 13 emergency that was terminated by the petition may be issued. Thereupon, the 14 governor shall issue an executive order or proclamation ending the state of disaster 15 or emergency.

(b) The petition terminating the entire declaration of a state of disaster or emergency or terminating one or more sections or subsections of the executive order or proclamation, duly signed by a majority of the surviving members of the House of Representatives or the Senate shall be transmitted to the clerk of the House of Representatives or secretary of the Senate, as applicable, who shall transmit the petition to the governor. The termination shall be effective upon the transmission of the petition to the governor.

(c) Further, the clerk of the House of Representatives or secretary of the
 Senate, as applicable, shall disseminate the petition promptly by means calculated
 to bring its contents to the attention of the general public and promptly file it with
 the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness and with
 the secretary of state.

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30 On page 2, delete lines 11 through 25 and insert the following:

31 "B.(1) The Either house of the legislature, in consultation after consulting 32 with the public health authority, by a petition signed by a majority of the surviving 33 members of either that house, may terminate a the entire state of public health 34 emergency or any section or subsection of the executive order or proclamation 35 declaring the state of public health emergency at any time. This petition terminating 36 the public health emergency or any section or subsection of the executive order or 37 proclamation declaring the state of public health emergency may establish a period 38 during which no other declaration of public health emergency related to the state of 39 public health emergency that was terminated or related to any section or subsection 40 of the executive order or proclamation declaring the state of public health emergency 41 that was terminated by the petition may be issued. Thereupon, the governor shall 42 issue an executive order or proclamation ending the state of public health or 43 emergency. 44 (b) The petition terminating the entire declaration of a state of public health
