# **Keyword and oneliner of the instrument as it left the House**

HEALTH CARE/RECORDS: Provides with respect to healthcare records

## **Report adopts Senate amendments to:**

- 1. Remove the limitation on the ability of insurers to request health records for underwriting purposes only.
- 2. Define "authorization" as required for a patient's insurer to receive requested medical records.

### Digest of the bill as proposed by the Conference Committee

<u>Present law</u> provides that a patient or his legal representative shall have a right to obtain a copy of the patient's entire medical records related in any way to the patient upon furnishing a signed authorization.

<u>Present law</u> defines "authorized" as a consent, an approval, or an authorization between persons.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds that a life, health, disability, or long-term care insurance company or its counsel, who has been authorized, as defined by <u>present law</u>, by the patient, shall have a right to obtain a copy of a patient's entire medical record.
