NURSING HOMES: Provides relative to emergency preparedness among licensed nursing homes

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 40:2009.25 and to repeal R.S. 36:259(B)(28) and R.S. 40:2009.1,
3	relative to nursing homes licensed by the Louisiana Department of Health; to provide
4	relative to emergency preparedness among nursing homes; to provide requirements
5	and standards for nursing home emergency preparedness plans; to provide
6	procedures for and schedules by which nursing homes shall develop and submit such
7	plans; to provide for duties of the Louisiana Department of Health and local offices
8	of emergency preparedness with respect to nursing home emergency preparedness;
9	to provide relative to sites to which nursing home residents may be evacuated; to
10	require nursing homes to produce certain reports pursuant to disasters and other
11	emergency events; to revise laws creating and providing for the Nursing Home
12	Emergency Preparedness Review Committee within the Louisiana Department of
13	Health; to repeal laws creating and providing for a nursing home advisory committee
14	within the Louisiana Department of Health; to provide for limitation of liability; to
15	require promulgation of administrative rules; to provide for an effective date; and to
16	provide for related matters.
17	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
18	Section 1. R.S. 40:2009.25 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

1	§2009.25. Emergency preparedness plans for nursing homes; applicable parishes;
2	requirements; Nursing Home Emergency Preparedness Review Committee;
3	rules and regulations; application
4	A. Due to the threat hurricanes pose to the parishes of Acadia, Ascension,
5	Assumption, Calcasieu, Cameron, Iberia, Jefferson, Jefferson Davis, Lafayette,
6	Lafourche, Orleans, Plaquemines, St. Bernard, St. Charles, St. James, St. John the
7	Baptist, St. Mary, St. Martin, St. Tammany, Tangipahoa, Terrebonne, and Vermilion,
8	nursing homes located in these parishes shall develop an emergency preparedness
9	plan which shall be submitted to the Louisiana Department of Health, bureau of
10	health services financing, emergency preparedness manager, by August 1, 2006.
11	B. Each emergency preparedness plan shall be reviewed and updated by the
12	nursing home annually. A summary of the updated plan shall be submitted to the
13	Louisiana Department of Health, bureau of health services financing, emergency
14	preparedness manager, by March first of each year. If the emergency preparedness
15	plan is changed, modified, or amended by the nursing home during the year, a
16	summary of the amended plan shall be submitted to the Louisiana Department of
17	Health, bureau of health services financing, emergency preparedness manager,
18	within thirty days of the amendment or modification.
19	C. Each summary of the emergency preparedness plan shall include and
20	identify at a minimum:
21	(1) A primary sheltering host site outside the area of risk, verified by written
22	agreements or contracts and any other alternative sheltering host sites that the
23	nursing home may have.
24	(2) Proof of transportation or a contract with a transportation company,
25	verified by a written transportation agreement or contract.
26	(3) Staffing patterns for evacuation, including contact information for such
27	staff.

1	D. The secretary of the Louisiana Department of Health shall prescribe and
2	publish, in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, criteria for evaluation
3	of all emergency preparedness plans.
4	E. The Louisiana Department of Health shall:
5	(1) Review the emergency preparedness plans.
6	(2) Prepare findings from the collected information.
7	(3) Share such findings with the Nursing Home Emergency Preparedness
8	Review Committee.
9	F. There is hereby created in the Louisiana Department of Health the
10	Nursing Home Emergency Preparedness Review Committee, hereinafter referred to
11	in this Section as the "committee." The committee, which shall convene at least
12	annually, shall be charged with reviewing the findings of the emergency
13	preparedness plan submitted to the department under this Section, identifying risks
14	and threats, identifying manpower issues for loading, transporting and unloading
15	residents, and developing recommendations for emergency preparedness plans to
16	promote the health, safety, and welfare of nursing home residents. The committee
17	shall be comprised of the following members:
18	(1) The secretary of the Louisiana Department of Health or his designee.
19	(2) The undersecretary of the Louisiana Department of Health or his
20	designee.
21	(3) The state health officer of the Louisiana Department of Health or his
22	designee.
23	(4) The Louisiana Department of Health, bureau of health services financing,
24	emergency preparedness manager who shall serve as the chairperson of the
25	committee.
26	(5) Five persons appointed by the secretary of the Louisiana Department of
27	Health who are directors or managers of the parish or local emergency preparedness
28	offices.

1	(6) The secretary of the Department of Transportation and Development or
2	his designee.
3	(7) The executive director of the Louisiana Nursing Home Association.
4	(8) The executive director of the Gulf States Association of Homes and
5	Services for the Aging.
6	(9) Two persons appointed by the secretary of the Louisiana Department of
7	Health who are either owners or administrators of nursing homes from the parishes
8	listed in Subsection A of this Section.
9	(10) The nursing home ombudsman from the governor's office of elderly
10	affairs or his designee.
11	(11) The chair of the emergency preparedness committee of the Louisiana
12	Nursing Home Association.
13	(12) The executive director of the Advocacy Center or his designee.
14	G. All members of the committee shall serve without compensation.
15	H. Any rule recommended or proposed by the committee shall be subject to
16	the review and approval of the secretary, and if approved, shall be promulgated by
17	the Louisiana Department of Health in accordance with the Administrative Procedure
18	Act.
19	A. As used in this Section, the following terms have the meaning ascribed
20	to them in this Subsection:
21	(1) "Department" means the Louisiana Department of Health.
22	(2) "Local office of emergency preparedness" means a parish office of
23	homeland security and emergency preparedness established pursuant to R.S. 29:727.
24	(3) "Nursing home" means a nursing home or nursing facility as defined in
25	R.S. 40:2009.2 which is licensed by the Louisiana Department of Health in
26	accordance with the requirements of R.S. 40:2009.3.
27	B. Each nursing home shall continue to utilize its emergency preparedness
28	plan that was in effect on March 1, 2022, until the process provided for in Subsection
29	C or D of this Section, whichever is applicable, has been completed. However,

1	during this period, if a nursing home updates or amends its emergency preparedness
2	plan pursuant to nursing home licensing rules in effect at the time, then the nursing
3	home shall utilize the updated emergency preparedness plan until the process
4	provided for in Subsection C or D of this Section, whichever is applicable, has been
5	completed.
6	C.(1) The provisions of this Subsection shall apply to each nursing home
7	located in the parishes of Acadia, Ascension, Assumption, Calcasieu, Cameron,
8	Iberia, Jefferson, Jefferson Davis, Lafayette, Lafourche, Orleans, Plaquemines, Saint
9	Bernard, Saint Charles, Saint James, Saint John the Baptist, Saint Martin, Saint
10	Mary, Saint Tammany, Tangipahoa, Terrebonne, and Vermilion.
11	(2) Each nursing home located in a parish listed in Paragraph (1) of this
12	Subsection shall develop an emergency preparedness plan that comports with the
13	requirements of this Subsection. Each such plan shall include and identify, at a
14	minimum, all of the following:
15	(a) A primary evacuation site and a secondary evacuation site, verified by
16	one or more contracts or other written agreements, as well as any other alternative
17	evacuation sites that the nursing home may have.
18	(b) Proof of transportation or a contract with a transportation company,
19	verified by a written transportation agreement or contract.
20	(c) Staffing patterns for evacuation, including contact information for facility
21	<u>staff.</u>
22	(d) Any data, other information, documentation, or other content required by
23	administrative rules of the department.
24	(3) Each nursing home located in a parish listed in Paragraph (1) of this
25	Subsection shall submit a copy of its full, updated emergency preparedness plan to
26	the department in electronic format. The emergency preparedness plan shall be
27	signed by the nursing home's owner or owners, or any designee of such parties, and
28	its administrator.

1	(4)(a) The department shall conduct a review of each nursing home
2	emergency preparedness plan submitted to it in accordance with Paragraph (3) of this
3	Subsection.
4	(b) The departmental review required by this Paragraph shall include
5	transmittal of each nursing home emergency preparedness plan to all of the following
6	entities for review by those entities:
7	(i) The office of state fire marshal.
8	(ii) The Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency
9	Preparedness.
10	(iii) The Department of Transportation and Development.
11	(iv) The Louisiana Emergency Response Network.
12	(v) The local office of emergency preparedness of the parish in which the
13	nursing home is located.
14	(vi) The local office of emergency preparedness of any parish in which an
15	evacuation site, including any unlicensed sheltering site, as identified in the nursing
16	home's emergency preparedness plan is located.
17	(c) The departmental review required by this Paragraph may include
18	transmittal to any other local, parish, regional, or other state agencies or entities for
19	consultation as the department deems appropriate. Each such agency or entity shall
20	cooperate and contribute to the department's review and approval process.
21	(5) Each entity listed in Subparagraph (4)(b) of this Subsection shall review
22	each nursing home emergency preparedness plan submitted to it and shall submit one
23	of the following documents to the department within ninety days of receipt of the
24	emergency preparedness plan from the department:
25	(a) A letter of preliminary approval of the nursing home's emergency
26	preparedness plan.
27	(b) A letter detailing what changes, amendments, or revisions to the
28	emergency preparedness plan are necessary.

1	(6) Any entity listed in Subparagraph (4)(b) of this Subsection that does not
2	respond to the department concerning a nursing home emergency preparedness plan
3	within ninety days of receipt of the plan shall be deemed to have granted preliminary
4	approval to the plan.
5	(7) After review of a nursing home emergency preparedness plan and results
6	of the review of the plan by the entities listed in Subparagraph (4)(b) of this
7	Subsection, the department shall transmit in electronic format either of the following
8	documents to the nursing home that submitted the plan:
9	(a) A notification letter communicating to the nursing home final approval
10	of the emergency preparedness plan.
11	(b) A notification letter communicating to the nursing home all required
12	changes, amendments, or other revisions to the emergency preparedness plan.
13	(8) Within fifteen days of receipt by the nursing home of an electronic
14	notification from the department that requires changes, amendments, or revisions to
15	the nursing home's emergency preparedness plan, the nursing home shall update and
16	revise its emergency preparedness plan to incorporate the required changes,
17	amendments, or revisions, and shall return a copy of the updated and revised
18	emergency preparedness plan to the department.
19	(9) Upon receipt of a nursing home's updated and revised emergency
20	preparedness plan, the department shall confirm that all required changes,
21	amendments, or revisions have been incorporated into the updated and revised
22	emergency preparedness plan, and shall issue an approval letter to the nursing home
23	for the emergency preparedness plan. If the required changes, amendments, or
24	revisions have not been incorporated, the department shall issue a letter of rejection
25	of the emergency preparedness plan to the nursing home.
26	(10) Each nursing home shall transmit a copy of its final, approved
27	emergency preparedness plan and a copy of the approval letter from the department
28	to the office of state fire marshal and the applicable local office or office of
29	emergency preparedness. The nursing home shall submit the final, approved

1	emergency preparedness plan in electronic format, if available, to the recipients
2	listed in this Paragraph. If the nursing home received a letter of rejection from the
3	department, the nursing home shall transmit a copy of that letter to the office of state
4	fire marshal and the applicable local office or office of emergency preparedness.
5	(11) The review and approval of nursing home emergency preparedness
6	plans by the department and each entity listed in Subparagraph (4)(b) of this
7	Subsection shall be performed pursuant to the department's and those entities'
8	respective areas of knowledge, expertise, or jurisdiction.
9	D.(1) The provisions of this Subsection shall apply to each nursing home
10	located in the parishes of Allen, Avoyelles, Beauregard, Bienville, Bossier, Caddo,
11	Caldwell, Catahoula, Claiborne, Concordia, DeSoto, East Baton Rouge, East Carroll,
12	East Feliciana, Evangeline, Franklin, Grant, Iberville, Jackson, LaSalle, Lincoln,
13	Livingston, Madison, Morehouse, Natchitoches, Ouachita, Pointe Coupee, Rapides,
14	Red River, Richland, Sabine, Saint Helena, Saint Landry, Tensas, Union, Vernon,
15	Washington, Webster, West Baton Rouge, West Carroll, West Feliciana, and Winn.
16	(2) Each nursing home located in a parish listed in Paragraph (1) of this
17	Subsection shall develop an emergency preparedness plan that comports with the
18	requirements of this Subsection. Each such plan shall include and identify, at a
19	minimum, all of the following:
20	(a) A primary evacuation site and a secondary evacuation site, verified by
21	one or more contracts or other written agreements, as well as any other alternative
22	evacuation sites that the nursing home may have.
23	(b) Proof of transportation or a contract with a transportation company,
24	verified by a written transportation agreement or contract.
25	(c) Staffing patterns for evacuation, including contact information for such
26	staff.
27	(d) Any data, other information, documentation, or other content required by
28	administrative rules of the department.

1	(3) Each nursing home located in a parish listed in Paragraph (1) of this
2	Subsection shall submit a copy of its full, updated emergency preparedness plan to
3	the department in electronic format. The emergency preparedness plan shall be
4	signed by the nursing home's owner or owners, or any designee of such parties, and
5	its administrator.
6	(4)(a) The department shall conduct a review of each nursing home
7	emergency preparedness plan submitted to it in accordance with Paragraph (3) of this
8	Subsection.
9	(b) The departmental review required by this Paragraph shall include
10	transmittal of each nursing home emergency preparedness plan to all of the following
11	entities for review by those entities:
12	(i) The office of state fire marshal.
13	(ii) The Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency
14	Preparedness.
15	(iii) The Department of Transportation and Development.
16	(iv) The Louisiana Emergency Response Network.
17	(v) The local office of emergency preparedness of the parish in which the
18	nursing home is located.
19	(vi) The local office of emergency preparedness of any parish in which an
20	evacuation site, including any unlicensed sheltering site, as identified in the nursing
21	home's emergency preparedness plan is located.
22	(c) The departmental review required by this Paragraph may include
23	transmittal to any other local, parish, regional, or other state agencies or entities for
24	consultation as the department deems appropriate. Each such agency or entity shall
25	cooperate and contribute to the department's review and approval process.
26	(5) Each entity listed in Subparagraph (4)(b) of this Subsection shall review
27	each nursing home emergency preparedness plan submitted to it and shall submit one
28	of the following documents to the department within ninety days of receipt of the
29	emergency preparedness plan from the department:

1	(a) A letter of preliminary approval of the nursing home's emergency
2	preparedness plan.
3	(b) A letter detailing what changes, amendments, or revisions to the
4	emergency preparedness plan are necessary.
5	(6) Any entity listed in Subparagraph (4)(b) of this Subsection that does not
6	respond to the department concerning a nursing home emergency preparedness plan
7	within ninety days of receipt of the plan shall be deemed to have granted preliminary
8	approval to the plan.
9	(7) After review of a nursing home emergency preparedness plan and results
10	of the review of the plan by the entities listed in Subparagraph (4)(b) of this
11	Subsection, the department shall transmit in electronic format either of the following
12	documents to the nursing home that submitted the plan:
13	(a) A notification letter communicating to the nursing home final approval
14	of the emergency preparedness plan.
15	(b) A notification letter communicating to the nursing home all required
16	changes, amendments, or other revisions to the emergency preparedness plan.
17	(8) Within fifteen days of receipt by the nursing home of an electronic
18	notification from the department that requires changes, amendments, or revisions to
19	the nursing home's emergency preparedness plan, the nursing home shall update and
20	revise its emergency preparedness plan to incorporate the required changes,
21	amendments, or revisions, and shall return a copy of the updated and revised
22	emergency preparedness plan to the department.
23	(9) Upon receipt of a nursing home's updated and revised emergency
24	preparedness plan, the department shall confirm that all required changes,
25	amendments, or revisions have been incorporated into the updated and revised
26	emergency preparedness plan, and shall issue an approval letter to the nursing home
27	for the emergency preparedness plan. If the required changes, amendments, or
28	revisions have not been incorporated, the department shall issue a letter of rejection
29	of the emergency preparedness plan to the nursing home.

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1	(10) Each nursing home shall transmit a copy of its final, approved
2	emergency preparedness plan and a copy of the approval letter from the department
3	to the office of state fire marshal and the applicable local office or office of
4	emergency preparedness. The nursing home shall submit the final, approved
5	emergency preparedness plan in electronic format, if available, to the recipients
6	listed in this Paragraph. If the nursing home received a letter of rejection from the
7	department, the nursing home shall transmit a copy of that letter to the office of state
8	fire marshal and the applicable local office or office of emergency preparedness.
9	(11) The review and approval of nursing home emergency preparedness
10	plans by the department and each entity listed in Subparagraph (4)(b) of this
11	Subsection shall be performed pursuant to the department's and those entities'
12	respective areas of knowledge, expertise, or jurisdiction.
13	E.(1)(a) On or before October 31, 2023, and annually thereafter, each
14	nursing home located in a parish listed in Paragraph (C)(1) of this Section shall
15	review its emergency preparedness plan. In conducting the review required by this
16	Subparagraph, a nursing home shall consider any changes in state licensing rules and
17	regulations and any changes in federal rules and regulations for nursing homes
18	adopted since the date of its last review of its emergency preparedness plan.
19	(b) On or before October 31, 2024, and annually thereafter, each nursing
20	home located in a parish listed in Paragraph (D)(1) of this Section shall review its
21	emergency preparedness plan. In conducting the review required by this
22	Subparagraph, a nursing home shall consider any changes in state licensing rules and
23	regulations and any changes in federal rules and regulations for nursing homes
24	adopted since the date of its last review of its emergency preparedness plan.
25	(2) If a nursing home conducts a review in accordance with Paragraph (1)
26	of this Subsection and determines that no changes, modifications, or amendments to
27	its emergency preparedness plan are necessary, then the nursing home shall notify
28	all of the following entities of this determination on or before November first:

1	(a) The local office of emergency preparedness of the parish in which the
2	nursing home is located.
3	(b) The local office of emergency preparedness of any parish in which a
4	sheltering site, alternative sheltering site, or evacuation site, as identified in the
5	nursing home's emergency preparedness plan, is located.
6	(c) The office of state fire marshal.
7	(d) The department.
8	(3)(a) Each notification required by Paragraph (2) of this Subsection shall
9	be in the form of a written attestation signed by the owner or owners, or any designee
10	of such parties, and the administrator of the nursing home submitting the
11	notification. A nursing home may submit an attestation provided for in this
12	Paragraph for no more than four consecutive years.
13	(b) If a nursing home has submitted an attestation provided for in
14	Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph for four consecutive years, then, in the year
15	following its last submission, the nursing home shall furnish a full emergency
16	preparedness plan in accordance with the procedures provided in Paragraphs (4)
17	through (12) of this Subsection.
18	(4) If a nursing home conducts a review in accordance with Paragraph (1)
19	of this Subsection and determines that any changes, modifications, or amendments
20	to its emergency preparedness plan are necessary, or if a nursing home is required
21	by Subparagraph (3)(b) of this Subsection to furnish a full emergency preparedness
22	plan, then the nursing home shall submit its full emergency preparedness plan,
23	inclusive of any updates and revisions, to the department on or before November
24	first. The full emergency preparedness plan shall be signed by the nursing home's
25	owner or owners, or any designee of such parties, and its administrator.
26	(5) The department shall conduct a review of each nursing home emergency
27	preparedness plan submitted to it in accordance with Paragraph (4) of this
28	Subsection.

1	(b) The departmental review required by this Paragraph shall include	
2	transmittal of each nursing home emergency preparedness plan to all of the following	
3	entities for review by those entities:	
4	(i) The office of state fire marshal.	
5	(ii) The Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency	
6	Preparedness.	
7	(iii) The Department of Transportation and Development.	
8	(iv) The Louisiana Emergency Response Network.	
9	(v) The local office of emergency preparedness of the parish in which the	
10	nursing home is located.	
11	(vi) The local office of emergency preparedness of any parish in which an	
12	evacuation site, including any unlicensed sheltering site, as identified in the nursing	
13	home's emergency preparedness plan is located.	
14	(c) The departmental review required by this Paragraph may include	
15	transmittal to any other local, parish, regional, or other state agencies or entities for	
16	consultation as the department deems appropriate. Each such agency or entity shall	
17	cooperate and contribute to the department's review and approval process.	
18	(6) Each entity listed in Subparagraph (5)(b) of this Subsection shall review	
19	each nursing home emergency preparedness plan submitted to it and shall submit one	
20	of the following documents to the department within ninety days of receipt of the	
21	emergency preparedness plan from the department:	
22	(a) A letter of preliminary approval of the nursing home's emergency	
23	preparedness plan.	
24	(b) A letter detailing what changes, amendments, or revisions to the	
25	emergency preparedness plan are necessary.	
26	(7) Any entity listed in Subparagraph (5)(b) of this Subsection that does not	
27	respond to the department concerning a nursing home emergency preparedness plan	
28	within ninety days of receipt of the plan shall be deemed to have granted preliminary	
29	approval to the plan.	

1	(8) After review of a nursing home emergency preparedness plan and results (8)
2	of the review of the plan by the entities listed in Subparagraph (5)(b) of this
3	Subsection, the department shall transmit in electronic format, on or before March
4	first, either of the following documents to the nursing home that submitted the plan:
5	(a) A notification letter communicating to the nursing home final approval
6	of the emergency preparedness plan.
7	(b) A notification letter communicating to the nursing home all required
8	changes, amendments, or other revisions to the emergency preparedness plan.
9	(9) Within fifteen days of receipt by the nursing home of an electronic
10	notification from the department that requires changes, amendments, or revisions to
11	the nursing home's emergency preparedness plan, the nursing home shall update and
12	revise its emergency preparedness plan to incorporate the required changes,
13	amendments, or revisions, and shall return a copy of the updated and revised
14	emergency preparedness plan to the department.
15	(10) Upon receipt of a nursing home's updated and revised emergency
16	preparedness plan, the department shall confirm that all required changes,
17	amendments, or revisions have been incorporated into the updated and revised
18	emergency preparedness plan, and shall issue an approval letter to the nursing home
19	for the emergency preparedness plan. If the required changes, amendments, or
20	revisions have not been incorporated, the department shall issue a letter of rejection
21	of the emergency preparedness plan to the nursing home. The department shall issue
22	the approval letter or rejection letter required by this Paragraph on or before May
23	fifteenth.
24	(11) On or before May thirty-first, each nursing home shall transmit a copy
25	of its final, approved emergency preparedness plan and a copy of the approval letter
26	from the department to the office of state fire marshal and the applicable local office
27	or office of emergency preparedness. The nursing home shall submit the final,
28	approved emergency preparedness plan in electronic format, if available, to the
29	recipients listed in this Paragraph. If the nursing home received a letter of rejection

1	from the department, the nursing home shall transmit a copy of that letter to the
2	office of state fire marshal and the applicable local office or office of emergency
3	preparedness on or before May thirty-first.
4	(12) The review and approval of nursing home emergency preparedness
5	plans by the department and each entity listed in Subparagraph (5)(b) of this
6	Subsection shall be performed pursuant to the department's and those entities'
7	respective areas of knowledge, expertise, or jurisdiction.
8	F. With respect to emergency preparedness among nursing homes, the
9	department shall do all of the following:
10	(1) After considering any recommendations provided by the Nursing Home
11	Emergency Preparedness Review Committee, prescribe and publish, in accordance
12	with the Administrative Procedure Act, rules pertaining to emergency preparedness
13	by nursing homes. The rules shall include but not be limited to all of the following:
14	(a) Requirements for nursing homes relating to emergency preparedness.
15	(b) Requirements for the content of nursing home emergency preparedness
16	plans.
17	(c) Requirements for the process by which the department reviews nursing
18	home emergency preparedness plans.
19	(d) Procedures for addressing situations wherein a nursing home makes
20	changes to its emergency preparedness plan on a schedule which deviates from that
21	provided in Subsection E of this Section.
22	(e) Minimum requirements for nursing homes which serve as evacuation
23	sites for other nursing homes.
24	(f) Minimum requirements for nonlicensed sheltering sites identified in
25	nursing home emergency preparedness plans.
26	(g) Requirements, timelines, and procedures for after-action reports as
27	provided for more specifically in Subsection I of this Section.
28	(h) Any rule recommended or proposed by the Nursing Home Emergency
29	Preparedness Review Committee and approved by the secretary of the department.

1	(2) Review and approve nursing home emergency preparedness plans in
2	accordance with its duly adopted rules and the applicable requirements of this
3	Section.
4	(3) Prepare findings based upon its review of nursing home emergency
5	preparedness plans, including any summaries of after-action reports as the secretary
6	of the department deems appropriate, to present to the Nursing Home Emergency
7	Preparedness Review Committee.
8	(4) The department shall implement a program for electronic submission of

Abstract: Effects a comprehensive revision of laws relating to emergency preparedness by and among state-licensed nursing homes.

<u>Proposed law</u> repeals and replaces <u>present law</u> addressing emergency preparedness by and among nursing homes licensed by the La. Department of Health (LDH).

<u>Proposed law</u> requires nursing homes to continue to utilize the emergency preparedness plans that were in effect on March 1, 2022, until the process for creation of new emergency preparedness plans provided for in <u>proposed law</u> has been completed. Provides, however, that if a nursing home updates or amends its emergency preparedness plan pursuant to <u>present administrative rule</u>, then the nursing home shall utilize the updated emergency preparedness plan until the process for creation of its new emergency preparedness plan provided for in <u>proposed law</u> has been completed.

<u>Proposed law</u> establishes the following schedule for creation of new emergency preparedness plans by licensed nursing homes located in the parishes of Acadia, Ascension, Assumption, Calcasieu, Cameron, Iberia, Jefferson, Jefferson Davis, Lafayette, Lafourche, Orleans, Plaquemines, Saint Bernard, Saint Charles, Saint James, Saint John the Baptist, Saint Mary, Saint Martin, Saint Tammany, Tangipahoa, Terrebonne, and Vermilion:

- (1) <u>On or before August 30, 2022</u>: Each nursing home located in one of the 22 parishes listed above shall develop a new emergency preparedness plan.
- (2) <u>On or before September 1, 2022</u>: Each nursing home located in a listed parish shall submit its new emergency preparedness plan to LDH.
- (3) <u>On or before March 1, 2023</u>: LDH shall transmit to each nursing home in a listed parish from which it received an emergency preparedness plan a notification letter communicating either final approval of the plan or requirements for revisions to the plan.
- (4) <u>On or before May 15, 2023</u>: LDH shall transmit to each nursing home in a listed parish from which it received a revised emergency preparedness plan a letter approving or rejecting the revised plan.
- (5) <u>On or before May 31, 2023</u>: Each nursing home located in a listed parish shall transmit to the office of state fire marshal and the applicable local office or office of emergency preparedness either of the following

- (a) Its final, approved emergency preparedness plan and a copy of the LDH approval letter.
- (b) Its letter of rejection of its emergency preparedness plan received from LDH.

<u>Proposed law</u> establishes the following schedule for creation of new emergency preparedness plans by licensed nursing homes located in the parishes of Allen, Avoyelles, Beauregard, Bienville, Bossier, Caddo, Caldwell, Catahoula, Claiborne, Concordia, DeSoto, East Baton Rouge, East Carroll, East Feliciana, Evangeline, Franklin, Grant, Iberville, Jackson, LaSalle, Lincoln, Livingston, Madison, Morehouse, Natchitoches, Ouachita, Pointe Coupee, Rapides, Red River, Richland, Sabine, Saint Helena, Saint Landry, Tensas, Union, Vernon, Washington, Webster, West Baton Rouge, West Carroll, West Feliciana, and Winn:

- (1) <u>On or before August 30, 2023</u>: Each nursing home located in one of the 42 parishes listed above shall develop a new emergency preparedness plan.
- (2) <u>On or before September 1, 2023</u>: Each nursing home located in a listed parish shall submit its new emergency preparedness plan to LDH.
- (3) <u>On or before March 1, 2024</u>: LDH shall transmit to each nursing home in a listed parish from which it received an emergency preparedness plan a notification letter communicating either final approval of the plan or requirements for revisions to the plan.
- (4) <u>On or before May 15, 2024</u>: LDH shall transmit to each nursing home in a listed parish from which it received a revised emergency preparedness plan a letter approving or rejecting the revised plan.
- (5) <u>On or before May 31, 2024</u>: Each nursing home located in a listed parish shall transmit to to the office of state fire marshal and the applicable local office or office of emergency preparedness either of the following
 - (a) Its final, approved emergency preparedness plan and a copy of the LDH approval letter.
 - (b) Its letter of rejection of its emergency preparedness plan received from LDH.

<u>Proposed law</u> establishes a schedule, procedures, and requirements relative to production of future versions of a nursing home's emergency preparedness plan after its first plan required by <u>proposed law</u> is fully developed.

<u>Proposed law</u> stipulates that review and approval of nursing home emergency preparedness plans by LDH and other state and local agencies with which LDH consults regarding such plans shall be performed pursuant to the department's and those agencies' respective areas of knowledge, expertise, or jurisdiction.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires LDH to promulgate administrative rules relative to emergency preparedness by nursing homes. Provides that such rules shall include but not be limited to all of the following:

- (1) Requirements for nursing homes relating to emergency preparedness.
- (2) Requirements for the content of nursing home emergency preparedness plans.
- (3) Requirements for the process by which the department reviews nursing home emergency preparedness plans.

- (4) Procedures for addressing situations wherein a nursing home makes changes to its emergency preparedness plan on a schedule which deviates from that provided in proposed law.
- (5) Minimum requirements for nursing homes which serve as evacuation sites for other nursing homes.
- (6) Minimum requirements for nonlicensed sheltering sites identified in nursing home emergency preparedness plans.
- (7) Requirements, timelines, and procedures for after-action reports as defined in and provided for more specifically in proposed law.
- (8) Any rule recommended or proposed by the Nursing Home Emergency Preparedness Review Committee and approved by the secretary of the department.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes LDH to initially promulgate any rules required by <u>proposed law</u> as emergency rules in accordance with <u>present law</u> relative to emergency rulemaking (R.S. 49:953.1).

<u>Proposed law</u> revises the membership of the 17-member Nursing Home Emergency Preparedness Review Committee provided for in <u>present law</u> by adding to the committee the following seven members:

- (1) Four members appointed by the secretary of LDH who are owners or administrators of nursing homes.
- (2) The director of the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness or his designee.
- (3) The director of the La. Medicaid program or his designee.
- (4) The assistant secretary of the LDH office of aging and adult services or his designee.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides requirements and standards relative to nonlicensed sheltering sites that nursing homes identify in emergency preparedness plans. Authorizes and provides for inspections of such sites by LDH, the office of state fire marshal, and local offices of emergency preparedness.

<u>Proposed law</u> stipulates that any refusal by a nonlicensed sheltering site to allow an inspection or survey of the site by LDH may result in disqualification of the site. Provides that if such a refusal to allow an inspection or survey occurs when nursing home residents are being sheltered at the site, then LDH may revoke the license of the nursing home that evacuated residents to the site.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires any nursing home that decides to evacuate residents to a nonlicensed sheltering site to notify LDH of this decision within one hour of the decision being made. Provides that upon receipt of such notification, the LDH licensing section and office of public health shall conduct a site visit at the site unless time, weather conditions, or other factors do not allow for such visit. Authorizes LDH to conduct onsite inspections of the site at any time deemed necessary or appropriate by the secretary of the department.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides, except in cases of willful misconduct, a limitation of liability for the state, LDH, employees of the state and LDH, local offices of emergency preparedness, and members of the Nursing Home Emergency Preparedness Review Committee associated with engaging in the activities and responsibilities provided for in <u>proposed law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that implementation and execution of an emergency preparedness plan shall be the duty and responsibility of the nursing home.

<u>Proposed law</u> repeals <u>present law</u> creating and providing for an 11-member nursing home advisory committee within LDH.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.

(Amends R.S. 40:2009.25; Repeals R.S. 36:259(B)(28) and R.S. 40:2009.1)

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Health and Welfare to</u> the <u>original</u> bill:

- 3. Stipulate that review and approval of nursing home emergency preparedness plans by LDH and other state and local agencies with which LDH consults regarding such plans shall be performed pursuant to the department's and those agencies' respective areas of knowledge, expertise, or jurisdiction.
- 4. Provide that implementation and execution of an emergency preparedness plan shall be the duty and responsibility of the nursing home.
- 5. Require LDH to implement a program for electronic submission of nursing home emergency preparedness plans no later than September 1, 2023.
