6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 26:80(A)(2) and 280(A)(2) are hereby amended and reenacted to
8	read as follows:
9	§80. Qualifications of applicants for permits
10	A. Applicants for state and local permits of all kinds shall demonstrate that
11	they meet all of the following qualifications and conditions:

13	(2) Be a citizen of the United States and the state of Louisiana and a resident
14	of the state of Louisiana continuously for a period of not less than two years next
15	preceding the date of the filing of the application. However, the requirements as to
16	Louisiana citizenship and residency do not apply to wholesalers or retailers who
17	held permits on or prior to January 1, 1946, or to liquor retailers as defined in R.S.
18	<u>26:2(14)</u> .

21	A. Applicants for state and local permits of all kinds shall demonstrate that
22	they meet the following qualifications and conditions:
