<u>Existing law</u> provides for the divestiture of the juvenile court's jurisdiction over serious felony offenses committed by juveniles over the age of 14 years.

<u>New law</u> retains <u>existing law</u> and provides that divestiture occurs only on a probable cause finding at a continued custody hearing or a return of a bill of indictment.

<u>New law</u> provides that the district attorney has discretion to file a petition in juvenile court or obtain an indictment for certain serious felony offenses listed in <u>existing law</u>. <u>New law</u> further provides that if the district attorney files a petition in juvenile court, and the child waives a continued custody hearing, the jurisdiction remains for all further proceedings, including review of bail, with the juvenile court.
