<u>New law</u> adds provisions to <u>existing law</u> to authorize an architect to engage in the practice of engineering, but only insofar as is necessary for the architect in his practice of architecture as defined in <u>existing law</u> (R.S. 37:141(B)(3)).

<u>New law</u> limits an architect's practice of engineering to minor mechanical, electrical, or civil-structural engineering work necessary as long as the work is secondary in nature and is substantially less in scope and magnitude when compared to the architectural portion of the work.

<u>New law</u> limits the maximum allowed occupancy load, size, and value for construction projects in which architects may engage in incidental engineering work for new construction or additions to the following:

- (1) For new construction not more than 299 occupants for assembly occupancy and 49 occupants for all other occupancies.
- (2) For additions not more than 299 occupants for assembly occupancy and 49 occupants for all other occupancies.

Effective August 1, 2022.
