1 through 5 and insert the following:

23	(b) One unit chosen from the following: Algebra III; Advanced Math
24	Functions and Statistics, Advanced Math-Pre-Calculus, Pre-Calculus, or Math
25	Methods I IB (Mathematical Studies SL); Calculus, AP Calculus AB, or Math
26	Methods II IB (Mathematics SL); AP Calculus BC; Probability and Statistics or AP
27	Statistics; IB Further Mathematics HL; IB Mathematics HL.
28	(3) Science - Four Units
29	(a) Biology I.
30	(b) Chemistry I.
31	(c) Two units chosen from the following: Earth Science; Environmental

37 38	(4) Social Studies - Four Units (a) One unit chosen from the following: U.S. History, A.B.U.S. History, or IB.

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(b) Computer Science - the two units shall be in principles, coding, and programming, which may include the following: Computer Science I, Computer Science II, Fundamentals of HTML, CSS, and JavaScript (Level 1), Advanced JavaScript, Functional Programming, and Web Development (Level 2), AP Computer Science A, AP Computer Science Principles, Computer Science Year One IB, and Computer Science Year Two IB.

(6) Art - one unit chosen from the following: Performance course in Music, Dance, or Theatre; Fine Arts Survey; Art I, II, III, and IV; Talented Art I, II, III, and IV; Talented Music I, II, III, and IV; Talented Theater Arts I, II, III, and IV; Speech III and Speech IV (one unit combined); AP Art History; AP Studio Art: 2-D Design; AP Studio Art: 3-D Design; AP Studio Art: Drawing; AP Music Theory; Film Study IIB; Film Study II IB; Music I IB; Music II IB; Art Design III IB; Art Design IV IB; Theatre I IB; or Drafting.

17(7) For the purposes of this Section, any core curriculum course that is taken18by a student who has been identified as gifted pursuant to State Board of Elementary19and Secondary Education policy and that is taken in fulfillment of the student's20Individualized Education Program shall be considered a gifted course and shall fulfill21the core curriculum requirement in its given subject area."
