Provides relative to assault upon a utility service employee

Current law provides the definitions of utility service and utility service employee for purposes of the crime of aggravated assault upon a utility service employee.

Proposed law amends the current law definition of utility service to add heat, steam, and sewer services. Proposed law amends the current law definition of utility service employee to include any person employed under contract of any utility service that provides electricity, gas, water, broadband, cable television, heat, steam, telecommunications services, or sewer services, whether privately, municipally, or cooperatively owned.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

Proposed law may result in an indeterminable increase in SGF expenditures in the Department of Public Safety and Corrections – Corrections Services (DPSC – CS) if a person is convicted of aggravated assault upon a utility service employee. The exact impact of the passage of this legislation on SGF expenditures is indeterminable, since it adds certain types of utility service employees to the class of victims for which a person can be convicted of aggravated assault upon a utility service employee.

SGF expenditures will increase by \$101.76 per offender per day to the extent that an offender is convicted and then subsequently housed in a state facility or \$26.39 per offender per day for an offender housed in a local facility. An offender sentenced to the custody of the DPSC – CS for one year would increase expenditures by \$37,142.40 (\$101.76 per day x 365 days) if housed in a state facility and \$9,632.35 (\$26.39 per day x 365 days) if housed in a local facility.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

Proposed law may result in an indeterminable increase in local revenues as a result of potential fines for convictions of aggravated assault upon a utility service employee. The maximum fine for conviction of aggravated assault upon a utility service employee is \$2,000. The exact impact on revenue is indeterminable because proposed law expands the class of victims for which a person can be convicted of aggravated assault upon a utility service employee, and there is no way to determine the number or amount of fines that will be assessed to those convicted due to the change in current law. The potential revenue will accrue to the local governing authority.
