SCHOOLS: Provides for safety protocols for elementary school students when being dropped off at and picked up from school

2	To enact R.S. 17:81(CC), relative to the powers and duties of public school governing		
3	authorities; to require public schools and school districts to establish carpool and bus		
4	line safety policies; and to provide for related matters.		
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:		
6	Section 1. R.S. 17:81(CC) is hereby enacted to read as follows:		
7	§81. General powers of local public school boards		
8	* * *		
9	CC. Each public school governing authority shall establish a policy that		
10	includes the following procedures for carpool and bus lines at any school that		
11	includes any of the grades kindergarten through five:		
12	(1) Students must remain behind a physical barrier until they enter a separate		
13	pick up area. Students shall remain a safe distance, as deemed appropriate for the		
14	particular school building, from the separate pick up area and wait for vehicles to		
15	come to a complete stop.		
16	(2) A student being dropped off shall remain in the appropriate passenger		
17	restraint until the vehicle in which he is a passenger comes to a complete stop.		
18	(3) A school employee working in the pick up area in any capacity shall		
19	wear a traffic vest.

**Abstract:** Requires public school governing authorities to establish carpool and bus line safety policies.

Present law provides for the general powers and duties of local public school boards.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires each public school governing authority to establish a safety policy for carpool and bus lines at schools with grades kindergarten through five.

At a minimum, the policy shall:

- (1) Require students to remain behind a barrier before entering a pick up area.
- (2) Require students to remain a safe distance from the pick up area and wait for vehicles to come to a complete stop.
- (3) Require a student being dropped off to remain in a passenger restraint until the vehicle in which he is a passenger comes to a complete stop.
- (4) Require school employees working in the pick up area to wear traffic vests.
- (5) Require that students in grades kindergarten through five be accompanied by a school employee while walking to and from a vehicle.
- (6) Require school administrators to post signage regarding the policy.

## Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

## The House Floor Amendments to the engrossed bill:

- 1. Remove the <u>proposed law</u> requirement that:
  - a. A student not enter the pick up area until the vehicle picking him up is in park.

- b. A student under the age of 10 years old be accompanied by a school employee while he is walking to and from a vehicle.
- 2. Add the <u>proposed law</u> requirement that:
  - a. Students remain a safe distance from the pick up area and wait for vehicles to come to a complete stop.
  - b. A student being dropped off remain in a passenger restraint until the vehicle in which he is a passenger comes to a complete stop.
  - c. School administrators post signage regarding the policy.
  - d. A student in grades kindergarten through five be accompanied by a school employee.
