## DIGEST

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 33:1375) provides that in New Orleans, the maximum penalty for a first offense violation of any ordinance is a fine of \$500. For the second or any subsequent offense, the maximum fine is \$1000. Provides that <u>present law</u> does not apply to any non-moving or parking violation or any other traffic violation.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but changes the fine for a first offense violation of any ordinance <u>from</u> \$500 to \$1,000. Further changes the fine for a second or any subsequent offense <u>from</u> \$1,000 to \$2,000.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 13:2500(C)) provides relative to the penalties which may be imposed by the Municipal and Traffic Court of New Orleans. Provides that court may impose penalties that do not exceed \$500 or six months in jail, or both.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u>, including the maximum fine for second and subsequent violations of ordinances, and consolidates the two statutory provisions.

<u>Proposed law</u> further provides that the maximum penalty for a building code violation involving residential property with more than three units or any property being used commercially is \$1000.

## <u>Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Local and Municipal Affairs to the engrossed bill</u>

- 1. Changes the maximum penalty for the first offense or second offense violation of any ordinance in the city of New Orleans.
- 2. Removes provision that provided that in default of the payment of a fine, the court may impose up to an additional 30 days in jail.
