HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 262

BY REPRESENTATIVE FREEMAN

MENTAL HEALTH: Requests certain state departments to create a task force to study the availability and possible expansion of seats for adolescents in psychiatric treatment facilities across southeast Louisiana

A RESOLUTION

2	To urge and request the Louisiana Department of Health (LDH) and the state Department
3	of Education (DOE) to create a task force to study the expansion of seat availability
4	for adolescents in long-term psychiatric residential treatment facilities (PRTF) across
5	southeast Louisiana and to submit its findings by February 1, 2024.
6	WHEREAS, according to the Kaiser Family Foundation (KFF), ninety percent of
7	adults in the United States believe that the country is facing a mental health crisis, perhaps
8	as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic; and
9	WHEREAS, the KFF also stated that the public's mental health and well-being in
10	this country have been affected in a variety of ways as a result of the isolation and instability
11	associated with the pandemic; and
12	WHEREAS, as a result of the impact of the pandemic, the emphasis on the mental
13	health of students has increased along with the awareness of the importance of school-based
14	mental health services; and
15	WHEREAS, the only facility that New Orleans public schools can send students
16	experiencing severe mental health crisis for overnight care is located in Shreveport,
17	Louisiana, which places an undue on burden on the parents and students; and
18	WHEREAS, parents often decline mental health treatment for their child because of
19	the distance, which places the child at a disadvantage; and

1	WHEREAS, requiring LDH to promote the long-term sustainability and expansion
2	of school-based mental health services could be beneficial to students and parents alike; and
3	WHEREAS, additionally, there are several policy changes that LDH can employ to
4	drastically increase the amount of mental health services provided by schools; and
5	WHEREAS, by requiring LDH to use the administration fee that is already collected
6	to build an internal billing system like many other states already have, Louisiana school
7	districts would be able to receive an extra ten percent of their Medicaid expenses and fund
8	a position at DOE to support school-based Medicaid services; and
9	WHEREAS, in addition to funding a position at DOE, the administrative fee could
10	be utilized to increase school reimbursements and reduce school administrative burdens; and
11	WHEREAS, DOE currently has one position dedicated to supporting and providing
12	technical assistance, and it is currently being funded by the Elementary and Secondary
13	School Emergency Relief (ESSER) fund; and
14	WHEREAS, this position is providing most of the technical assistance and
15	professional development to schools on the school-based Medicaid program and is necessary
16	to continue after the ESSER funds are depleted; and
17	WHEREAS, in order to continue the ESSER funding, LDH should use a portion of
18	the existing administrative fee to fund this position at DOE permanently; and
19	WHEREAS, other states have similar positions in their education agencies that are
20	funded using the administrative fee that the Medicaid agency collects and require the
21	administrative fee generated by the Medicaid agency to cover program expenses only; and
22	WHEREAS, the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act provides support for mental
23	health service programs throughout the country, particularly in schools; and
24	WHEREAS, the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act instructs the Centers for
25	Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) to update the regulations around the school-based
26	Medicaid program in order to reduce the administrative burden on schools and, while they
27	have not been announced yet, these guidelines are expected in the summer of 2023; and
28	WHEREAS, administrative burdens on schools could be reduced by requiring LDH
29	to make changes to the school-based Medicaid program as allowed by the recently-released
30	CMS guidelines; and

1	WHEREAS, in order to meet this requirement of making changes to the school-based
2	Medicaid program, LDH will need to submit a Medicaid state plan amendment (SPA) to take
3	advantage of the new guidelines established by CMS; and
4	WHEREAS, LDH would have to submit a SPA no later than October 2023, which
5	includes updates allowed by the newly released guidance; and
6	WHEREAS, this legislature should also consider providing additional funding to
7	build a pipeline of school-based mental health professionals by increasing scholarships, debt
8	forgiveness, or other methods; and
9	WHEREAS, these program changes, if implemented, are expected to significantly
10	reduce, or eliminate, the need for schools to bill for Medicaid services.
11	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
12	urge and request the Louisiana Department of Health and the state Department of Education
13	to create a task force to study the need to expand the number of seats serving adolescents in
14	long-term psychiatric residential treatment facilities across southeast Louisiana.
15	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following individuals shall serve as members
16	of the task force:
17	(1) The secretary of the Louisiana Department of Health or his designee.
18	(2) The assistant secretary of the Louisiana Department of Health office of behavioral
19	health or his designee.
20	(3) The president of the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education or his
21	designee.
22	(4) The assistant superintendent of the state Department of Education or his designee.
23	(5) The president of the Louisiana Psychological Association or his designee.
24	(6) The president of the Louisiana Psychiatric Medical Association or his designee.
25	(7) The president of the Louisiana Hospital Association or his designee.
26	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Louisiana Department of Health and the state
27	Department of Education may choose to include nonprofit and private providers of long-term
28	psychiatric residential treatment facilities to serve on the task force.
29	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of the task force shall appoint a
30	chairman at the convening of its first meeting.

1	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that LDH and DOE shall provide staff support to the
2	task force.
3	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force, once determined, shall address
4	the following questions:
5	(1) What is the landscape of long-term PRTFs available to adolescents in southeast
6	Louisiana compared to the need?
7	(2) What does a fully financed adolescent behavioral health PRTF consist of?
8	(3) What, if any, are the funding sources?
9	(4) What does a fully leveraged Medicaid system do to fund the expansion of the
10	number of seats serving adolescents in PRTFs across southeast Louisiana?
11	(5) What partners or entities, if any, exist that may expand or open a child and
12	adolescent PRTF within the next two years?
13	(6) What barriers exist to developing and retaining both medical and front-line staff
14	of PRTFs in the region?
15	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Louisiana Department of Health and the state
16	Department of Education shall take action on the Medicaid recommendations identified in
17	this Resolution no later than October 2023 and shall jointly present to the House Committee
18	on Health and Welfare the progress of these actions by the end of the 2023 calendar year and
19	thereafter on an annual basis.
20	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that on or before February 1, 2024, the task force
21	shall submit to the House Committee on Health and Welfare and the David R. Poynter
22	Legislative Research Library a written report of its findings and recommendations.
23	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the
24	secretary of the Louisiana Department of Health, president of the State Board of Elementary
25	and Secondary Education, the superintendent of the state Department of Education, the
26	president of the Louisiana Psychological Association, the president of the Louisiana
27	Psychiatric Medical Association, and the president of the Louisiana Hospital Association.
