## HOUSE SUMMARY OF SENATE AMENDMENTS

## HB 182 2023 Regular Session Edmonston

VACCINES/VACCINATION: Provides that no person shall be required to receive a COVID-19 vaccine as a condition of enrollment or attendance at any public or nonpublic school and exempts college students who only register for online courses from general immunization requirements

## **Synopsis of Senate Amendments**

1. Broaden <u>present law</u> vaccine exemption to include college students who only register for online courses.

## Digest of Bill as Finally Passed by Senate

<u>Present law</u> requires each person entering any school (licensed day care centers, elementary and secondary schools, and colleges/universities) for the first time to present satisfactory evidence of immunity to or immunization against vaccine-preventable diseases according to a schedule approved by the office of public health (OPH) or to present evidence of an immunization program in progress. Exempts a student seeking to enter any such school or facility from this requirement if he submits a written statement from a doctor relative to medical contraindication or a written dissent. <u>Proposed law</u> also exempts college students who only register for online courses.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the schedule may provide specific requirements based on age, grade in school, or type of school. Authorizes a school, with OPH approval, to require immunizations or proof of immunity more extensive than required by the OPH schedule. <u>Proposed law</u> provides, notwithstanding <u>present law</u>, that no person shall be required to receive a COVID-19 vaccine as a condition of initial enrollment or continuing attendance at such a school (public or nonpublic).
