Present law provides for the crime of carjacking.

Proposed law retains present law.

<u>Present law</u> provides the penalties for the crime of carjacking as follows:

- (1) Imprisonment at hard labor for not less than two years nor more than 20 years, without benefit of parole, probation, or suspension of sentence.
- (2) When serious bodily injury results, imprisonment at hard labor for not less than 10 years nor more than 20 years, without benefit of parole, probation, or suspension of sentence.

Proposed law increases the penalties for the crime of carjacking as follows:

- (1) Minimum penalty for carjacking increases <u>from</u> not less than two years <u>to</u> not less than five years, without benefit of parole, probation, or suspension of sentence.
- (2) Minimum penalty of carjacking when serious bodily injury results increases <u>from</u> not less than 10 years <u>to</u> not less than 20 years and the maximum penalty <u>from</u> not more than 20 years <u>to</u> not more than 30 years, without benefit of parole, probation, or suspension of sentence.

Proposed law otherwise retains present law.

Effective July 1, 2024.
