DISTRICTS/SPECIAL: Creates the Shreveport Healthcare and Innovation District

AN ACT

2	To enact Chapter 27-I of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised
3	of R.S. 33:9039.131, relative to the city of Shreveport; to create the Shreveport
4	Healthcare and Innovation District; to provide relative to the purpose, boundaries,
5	governance, and powers and duties of the district; and to provide for related matters.
6	Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published
7	as provided by Article III, Section 13 of the Constitution of
8	Louisiana.
9	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
10	Section 1. Chapter 27-I of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950,
11	comprised of R.S. 33:9039.131, is hereby enacted to read as follows:
12	CHAPTER 27-I. SHREVEPORT HEALTHCARE AND INNOVATION DISTRICT
13	§9039.131. Shreveport Healthcare and Innovation District
14	A. There is hereby created within the city of Shreveport, as more specifically
15	provided in Subsection B of this Section, a body politic and corporate which shall
16	be known as the Healthcare and Innovation District, referred to in this Section as the
17	"district". The district shall be a political subdivision of the state as defined in the
18	Constitution of Louisiana.
19	B. The boundaries of the district shall encompass the area included within
20	the following perimeter: Begin at the southeast corner of Lot 1, Centres Youree

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Commercial Subdivision, as per plat filed and recorded in Book 3000, Page 245, of the Conveyance Records of Caddo Parish, Louisiana; Run thence westerly and northwesterly along the southerly line of said Lot 1 to the southwest corner thereof and a point being the southeasterly corner of Lot 361, Broadmoor Subdivision, Unit No. 2, as per plat filed and recorded in Book 150, Page 272, of the Conveyance Records of Caddo Parish, Louisiana; Run thence Northwesterly along said southerly line of Lots 361 thru 354 of said Broadmoor Subdivision, Unit No. 2 to the southwesterly corner of said Lot 354; Run thence Southwesterly across Beverly Place to the southeasterly corner of Lot 189 of said Broadmoor Subdivision, Unit No. 2; Run thence Westerly along the southerly line of said Lot 189 to the southwesterly corner thereof; Run thence Northeasterly along the westerly line of Lots 189 thru 187 of said Broadmoor Subdivision, Unit No. 2, and Bayou Pierre to the northwesterly corner of said Lot 187 and a point on the southerly right-of-way line of Kings Highway; Run thence Westerly along said southerly right-of-way line of Kings Highway to the west right-of-way line of Line Avenue; Run thence South along said west right-of-way line of Line Avenue to the north right-of-way line of Jefferson Place; Run thence West along said north right-of-way line of Jefferson Place to the east right-of-way line of Fairfield Avenue; Run thence North along said east right-of-way line of Fairfield Avenue to the southerly right-of-way line of Kings Highway; Run thence Westerly along said southerly right-of-way line of Kings Highway to the westerly right-of-way line of I-49; Run thence Southerly along said westerly right-of-way line of I-49 to the northerly right-of-way line of St. Vincent Avenue; Run thence Southwesterly along said northerly right-of-way line of St. Vincent Avenue to the north right-of-way line of Claiborne Avenue; Run thence West along said north right-of-way line of Claiborne Avenue to the westerly right-of-way line of Linwood Avenue; Run thence Northerly along said west right-of-way line of Linwood Avenue to the north right-of-way line of Jennings Street; Run thence West along said north right-of-way line of Jennings Street to the west right-of-way line of McWillie Street; Run thence North along said west

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right-of-way line of McWillie Street to the southerly right-of-way line of Kings Highway; Run thence West along said southerly right-of-way line of Kings Highway to the westerly right-of-way line of Kansas City Railroad; Run thence Southwesterly along said westerly right-of-way line of Kansas City Railroad to the north right-of-way line of Claiborne Avenue; Run thence West along said north right-of-way line of Claiborne Avenue to the westerly right-of-way line of Mansfield Road; Run thence Northerly along said westerly right-of-way line of Mansfield Road to the southerly right-of-way line of Kings Highway; Run thence Westerly along said southerly right-of-way line of Kings Highway to the east right-of-way line of Hearne Avenue; Run thence North along said east right-of-way line of Hearne Avenue to the north right-of-way line of Lakeshore Drive; Run thence Easterly along said north right-of-way line of Lakeshore Drive to the westerly right-of-way line of the I-49 Exit/Interchange Roadways; Run thence Southwesterly along said westerly right-of-way line of the I-49 Exit/Interchange Roadways to the northerly right-of-way line of Texas Avenue; Run thence Northeasterly along said northerly right-of-way line of Texas Avenue to the west right-of-way line of Mansfield Road; Run thence Southwesterly along said west right-of-way line of Mansfield Road to the north right-of-way line of Kings Highway; Run thence Easterly along said north right-of-way line of Kings Highway to the easterly right-of-way line of the Kansas City Railroad; Run thence Northeasterly along said easterly right-of-way line of Kansas City Railroad to the southwest corner of Midtown Industrial Subdivision, as per plat filed and recorded in Book 800, Page 33, of the Conveyance Records of Caddo Parish, Louisiana; Run thence East along the south line of said Midtown Industrial Subdivision to the southeast corner thereof and a point on the west right-of-way line of Linwood Avenue; Run thence East across Linwood Avenue to the east right-of-way line thereof; Run thence South along said east right-of-way line of Linwood Avenue to the north right-of-way line of Glen Oak Street; Run thence East along said north right-of-way line of Glen Oak Street to the west right-of-way line of Samford Avenue; Run thence North along said west right-of-way line of

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Samford Avenue to the south right-of-way line of Wilkinson Street; Run thence East along said south right-of-way line of Wilkinson Street across I-49 and then to the westerly right-of-way line of Fairfield Avenue; Run thence Southwesterly along said westerly right-of-way line of Fairfield Avenue to the south right-of-way line of Rutherford Street; Run thence East along said south right-of-way line of Rutherford Street to the west right-of-way line of Line Avenue; Run thence South along said west right-of-way line of Line Avenue to the north right-of-way line of Kings Highway; Run thence Easterly along said north right-of-way line of Kings Highway to the east right-of-way line of Creswell Avenue; Run thence North along said east right-of-way line of Creswell Avenue to the south right-of-way line of Columbia Street; Run thence East along said south right-of-way line of Columbia Street to the east right-of-way line of Highland Avenue; Run thence North along said east right-of-way line of Highland Avenue to the south right-of-way line of Columbia Street; Run thence East along said south right-of-way line of Columbia Street to the west right-of-way line of Centenary Boulevard; Run thence Northeasterly along said west right-of-way line of Centenary Boulevard to the south right-of-way line of East Wilkinson Street; Run thence East along said south right-of-way line of East Wilkinson Street to the west right-of-way line of Woodlawn Avenue; Run thence South along said west right-of-way line of Woodlawn Avenue to the north right-of-way line of East Rutherford Street; Run thence East along said north right-of-way line of East Rutherford Street to the west right-of-way line of Elm Street; Run thence South along said west right-of-way line of Elm Street to the north right-of-way line of East Kings Highway; Run thence Southeasterly along said north right-of-way line of East Kings Highway to the east right-of-way line for Bayou Pierre; Run thence Northeasterly along said east right-of-way line of Bayou Pierre to the westerly right-of-way line of Youree Drive; Run thence Southeasterly along said westerly right-of-way line of Youree Drive to the Point of Beginning.

C. The district is created for the purposes of:

1	(1) Facilitating the creation of high paying jobs by assisting the biomedical
2	institutions and employees in the district with development of bioscience facilities
3	and programs.
4	(2) Acting to acquire and develop real estate needed to grow the academic
5	research institutions within the district and receiving public and private funds for
6	such purpose.
7	(3) Assisting with increasing research and training dollars for institutions
8	within the district and receiving public and private funds for such purpose.
9	(4) Assisting with increasing research dollars for health-related research and
10	training.
11	(5) Increasing basic and clinical research and the health and bioscience
12	workforce.
13	(6) Working to bridge commercialization opportunities from research
14	developed within the district.
15	(7) Enhancing interdisciplinary biosciences.
16	(8) Acting as a link to private sector life sciences companies in the state with
17	a view toward job growth in the district.
18	D.(1) In order to provide for the orderly development of the district and
19	effect the purposes of the district, the district shall be administered and governed by
20	an eleven-member board of commissioners, referred to in this Chapter as the
21	"board", composed as follows:
22	(a) The two members of the Louisiana Senate whose districts encompass an
23	area included within the district shall each appoint one member.
24	(b) The member of the Louisiana House of Representatives whose district
25	encompasses all or the greater portion of the area of the district shall appoint one
26	member.
27	(c) The Caddo Parish Commission shall appoint one member who shall be
28	a resident of the district, own a business within the district, or be a person employed
29	within the district.

1	(d) The governing board of the Greater Shreveport Chamber of Commerce
2	shall appoint one member who is a member of the chamber of commerce.
3	(e) The governing board of the Shreveport-Bossier African American
4	Chamber of Commerce shall appoint one member who is a member of the chamber
5	of commerce.
6	(f) The chief executive officer of the Ochsner Health System or his designee.
7	(g) The chief executive of the Willis Knight Health System or his designee.
8	(h) The chancellor of the LSU Health Science Center or his designee.
9	(i) The president of Centenary College of Louisiana or his designee.
10	(k) The mayor of the city of Shreveport or his designee.
11	(2)(a) Members appointed pursuant to Subparagraphs (1)(a) through (e) of
12	this Subsection shall serve three-year terms after serving initial terms as provided in
13	this Subparagraph. Two members shall serve three-year initial terms, two members
14	shall serve two-year initial terms, and two members shall serve one-year initial terms
15	as determined by lot at the first meeting of the board.
16	(b) Members serving pursuant to Subparagraphs (1)(f) through (k) of this
17	Subsection shall serve during their terms of office. Any designee serving on the
18	board shall serve at the pleasure of the designating authority.
19	(3) Any vacancy which occurs prior to the expiration of a term shall be filled
20	in the same manner as the original appointment for the unexpired term.
21	(4) The board shall elect from its members a chairman, a vice chairman, a
22	secretary-treasurer, and other officers as it deems necessary. The duties of the
23	officers shall be fixed by the bylaws adopted by the board.
24	(5) The minute books and archives of the district shall be maintained by the
25	secretary-treasurer of the board. The monies, funds, and accounts of the district shall
26	be in the official custody of the board.
27	(6) The board shall adopt rules and regulations as it deems necessary or
28	advisable for conducting its business affairs. Rules and regulations of the board
29	relative to the notice and conduct of meetings shall conform to applicable law. The

1	board shall hold regular meetings as provided for in the bylaws and may hold special
2	meetings at times and places within the district as prescribed in the bylaws.
3	(7) A majority of the members of the board constitute a quorum for the
4	transaction of business. The board shall keep minutes of all meetings and shall make
5	them available through the secretary-treasurer of the board.
6	(8) The members of the board shall serve without compensation but shall be
7	reimbursed for reasonable out-of-pocket expenses directly related to the governance
8	of the district.
9	E. The district, acting by and through its board, shall have and exercise all
10	powers of a political subdivision necessary or convenient for the carrying out of its
11	objects and purposes, including but not limited to the following:
12	(1) To sue and be sued.
13	(2) To adopt, use, and alter at will a corporate seal.
14	(3) To acquire by gift, grant, purchase, or lease, and to hold and use any
15	property, real, personal, or mixed, tangible or intangible, or any interest therein
16	necessary or desirable for carrying out the objects and purposes of the district. The
17	district shall have no power of expropriation or eminent domain.
18	(4) To sell, transfer, convey, or alienate any property acquired by it, or any
19	interest therein at any time, by negotiation, to accomplish the objects and purposes
20	of the district.
21	(5) To lease or sublease all or any portion of any property, by negotiation,
22	for a term not exceeding ninety-nine years at a fixed or variable rental and without
23	advertisement for public bids.
24	(6) To make and collect reasonable charges for the use of property owned
25	by the district and for services rendered by the district and to regulate reasonably the
26	fees and charges to be made by privately owned, leased, or otherwise authorized uses
27	of property owned by the district, or sold or leased by the district, when such
28	property is offered for the use of the public.

1	(7) To enter into contracts to achieve the district's objects and purposes
2	including but not limited to contracts for professional and other services and for the
3	purchase, lease, acquisition, sale, construction, operation, maintenance, and
4	improvements of land, public or private works, and facilities, as the district deems
5	necessary or convenient to accomplish the objects and purposes of the district.
6	(8) To plan, develop, operate, and maintain activities and land uses to foster
7	creation of new jobs, economic development, industry, biomedical research, clinical
8	trials, commerce, manufacturing, relocation of people and businesses to the area, the
9	acquisition of land and improvements, and the construction, operation, and
10	maintenance of facilities, improvements, and infrastructure, including buildings,
11	roads, drainage, and utilities, and other functions and activities to accomplish the
12	objects and purposes of the district and to protect the public health and welfare.
13	(9) To develop, activate, construct, exchange, acquire, improve, repair,
14	operate, maintain, lease, mortgage, sell, and pledge movable and immovable
15	property, servitudes, facilities, and works under such terms and conditions as the
16	district may deem necessary or appropriate for any purpose, notwithstanding the
17	limitations of Chapter 13 of this Title and Chapter 10 of Title 41 of the Louisiana
18	Revised Statutes of 1950.
19	(10) To borrow money and pledge all or part of its revenues, leases, rents,
20	and other income, fees, or resources of any nature as security for such loans.
21	(11) To appoint officers, agents, and employees, including an executive
22	director and staff, prescribe their duties, and fix their compensation.
23	(12) To establish public-private partnerships and joint ventures for the
24	benefit of the district.
25	(13) To solicit, accept, and collect funds, federal, state or local grants,
26	donations, and contributions in cash or in property and to take by will or bequest,
27	donation, devise, or other legal means, in trust or absolutely, real or personal
28	property, whether tangible or intangible, subject to the terms, conditions, or
29	limitations contained in the instrument by which such property is acquired.

1	(14) To acquire real and personal property, including health education and
2	enhancement facilities, by lease, purchase, or donation, including but not limited to
3	the following: land; improvements; oil, gas, and mineral rights; stocks; bonds; notes;
4	and any other things of value. Title thereto shall be taken in the name of the district.
5	(15) To negotiate lease or sale transactions with any public or private
6	educational institution in the manner set forth in R.S. 33:4717.2, including
7	institutions with which the commissioners serving on the board are associated; the
8	only requirement shall be that representatives of such educational institutions may
9	continue to serve but shall recuse themselves from any participation on any issues
10	related to the educational institution they represent, notwithstanding any law to the
11	contrary.
12	(16) To develop and implement a master plan for the district related to
13	biosciences, but in coordination with the Louisiana Board of Regents with respect
14	to public postsecondary educational institutions.
15	(17) To construct, acquire, reconstruct, rehabilitate, improve, repair, operate,
16	lease, as lessor or lessee, or to enter into contracts for the management and operation
17	of wet labs, research facilities, manufacturing facilities, clinics, laboratories, or any
18	other facility, building, or structure in the district which may be of use or benefit to
19	the development of biosciences. The district may construct, acquire, reconstruct,
20	rehabilitate, improve, repair, operate, lease, as lessor or lessee, or enter into contracts
21	for the management and operation of support facilities that are useful, necessary, or
22	convenient, including but not limited to parking facilities, office buildings for
23	researchers, dormitories, homes, or residences for professionals. The district may
24	finance, acquire property for, and plan and acquire, construct, reconstruct,
25	rehabilitate, or improve facilities for, and provide and operate, central services and
26	shared facilities for the common use of institutions or companies in the complex. The
27	district may, at its option, rent, lease, or sell the use of these facilities or services.
28	F. The exercise by the district, through its board, of the powers conferred by
29	this Chapter are deemed and held to be essential governmental functions of the state.

1	The district shall not be required to pay any taxes including but not limited to sales
2	and use taxes, ad valorem taxes, income, or any other taxes of any kind or nature, or
3	assessments upon any property acquired or leased by the district, or upon the income
4	therefrom. The district is subject to the Public Bid Law, the Public Records Law, the
5	Open Meetings Law, and the Code of Governmental Ethics.
6	G.(1) The district may undertake a project which may include but not be
7	limited to land acquisition, design, construction, renovation, rehabilitation,
8	equipping, infrastructure, and other improvements or modifications and all
9	operational expenses including maintenance, utility, and personnel costs and other
10	activities necessary or convenient thereto. The district may establish projects for
11	bioscience and health products, including projects related to:
12	(a) Research and development.
13	(b) Invention and discovery.
14	(c) Commercialization.
15	(d) Production and manufacturing of goods and products, including facilities
16	for manufacturing.
17	(e) Development of production process and delivery system purposes in,
18	involved in, based on, or related to or intended to advance the state of knowledge,
19	skill, and understanding of the biosciences including:
20	(i) Wet laboratories.
21	(ii) Clean rooms.
22	(iii) Dry laboratories.
23	(iv) Research and development facilities.
24	(v) Genetics facilities and equipment.
25	(vi) Pharmaceutical facilities and equipment.
26	(vii) Biotechnology incubators.
27	(viii) Bioscience and biotech health care facilities.
28	(ix) Biotech facilities.
29	(x) Bioscience facilities.

1	(xi) Other similar projects.
2	(2) Bioscience education, including health or biotech education programs in
3	cooperation with affiliate institutions of higher education.
4	(3) Access to public safety facilities and equipment.
5	(4) Streets and roads.
6	(5) Drainage services.
7	(6) Wastewater services.
8	(7) Potable water services.
9	(8) Telecommunication facilities.
10	(9) Demolition of existing structures.
11	(10) Chilled water services.
12	(11) Steam services.
13	(12) Industrial gases services.
14	(13) Other utility and process and production services.
15	(14) The support of any other type of bioscience projects or safety, security
16	(police), parking, housing (student and workforce), conference and meeting facilities,
17	transportation (pedestrian and vehicular), emergency preparedness, emergency
18	operations, beautification, image, district identity, centralized laundry, janitorial
19	services, maintenance services (grass cutting, street cleaning), development and
20	enforcement of district standards for buildings (architectural), landscaping, streets
21	and sidewalks, lighting, and signage.
22	H. All state officers and agencies may render such services to the district
23	within their respective functions as requested by the district. In addition, the district
24	and agencies may enter into such contracts, cooperative endeavor agreements, or
25	other agreements necessary or convenient to carry out the purposes of this Chapter.

Abstract: Creates the Shreveport Healthcare and Innovation District as a political subdivision of the state to assist the biomedical institutions and employees in the district with development of bioscience facilities and programs.

<u>Proposed</u> law creates the Shreveport Healthcare and Innovation District as a political subdivision of the state. Provides that the district is created for multiple purposes, including acquiring and developing real estate needed to grow the academic research institutions within the district and facilitating the creation of high paying jobs by assisting the biomedical institutions and employees in the district with development of bioscience facilities and programs.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the district is governed by an 11-member board of commissioners composed as follows:

- (1) One member appointed by each of the two members of the La. Senate whose districts encompass an area included within the district.
- One member appointed by the member of the La. House of Rep. whose district encompasses all or the greater portion of the area of the district.
- (3) One member appointed by the Caddo Parish Commission.
- (4) One member appointed by the governing board of the Greater Shreveport Chamber of Commerce.
- (5) One member appointed by the governing board of the Shreveport-Bossier African American Chamber of Commerce.
- (6) The chief executive officer of the Ochsner Health System or his designee.
- (7) The chief executive of the Willis Knight Health System or his designee.
- (8) The chancellor of the LSU Health Science Center or his designee.
- (9) The president of Centenary College of Louisiana or his designee.
- (10) The mayor of the city of Shreveport or his designee.

Provides that appointed members serve staggered three-year terms.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides relative to the powers and duties of the district including but not limited to the following:

- (1) To sue and be sued.
- (2) To adopt, use, and alter at will a corporate seal.

- (3) To acquire by gift, grant, purchase, lease, or otherwise and to hold and use property, real, personal, or mixed, tangible or intangible, or any interest therein necessary or desirable for carrying out the objects and purposes of the district.
- (4) To sell, transfer, convey, or alienate any property acquired by it, or any interest therein at any time, by negotiation, to accomplish the objects and purposes of the district.
- (5) To make and collect reasonable charges for the use of property owned by the district and for services rendered by the district and to regulate reasonably the fees and charges to be made by privately owned, leased, or otherwise authorized uses of property owned by the district, or sold or leased by the district, when same are offered for the use of the public.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the district to undertake a project which may include but not be limited to land acquisition, design, construction, renovation, rehabilitation, equipping, infrastructure, and other improvements or modifications and all operational expenses including maintenance, utility, and personnel costs and other activities necessary or convenient thereto. <u>Proposed law</u> additionally authorizes the district to establish projects for bioscience and health products.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes all state officers and agencies to render services to the district within their respective functions as requested by the district. Additionally authorizes the district and the agencies to enter into contracts, cooperative endeavor agreements, or other agreements necessary or convenient to carry out the purposes of <u>proposed law</u>.
