SEAFOOD: Authorizes the use of state property for seafood research

2	To amend and reenact Section 1 of Act No. 160 of the 2017 Regular Session, relative to the
3	Grand Isle Port Commission; to provide relative to the use of certain state property
4	near Grand Isle for seafood research; to provide relative to the specification of the
5	boundaries and size of the areas in which the research will be conducted; to require
6	the port commission adhere to the Louisiana Wildlife and Fisheries Commission
7	rules and regulations; and to provide for related matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. Section 1 of Act No. 160 of the 2017 Regular Session of the Legislature
0	is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
1	Section 1. (A) The Grand Isle Port Commission may use, in accordance with
12	this Act, the following described state water bottoms, water columns, and water
13	surfaces above the specified sections of water bottoms:

26	Notwithstanding the provisions of R.S. 56:431.2(A)(1), the port commission shall
27	adhere to the rules and regulations adopted by the Louisiana Wildlife and Fisheries
28	Commission governing alternative oyster culture activity.

<u>Present law</u> (Act No. 160 of the 2017 Regular Session, §1) authorizes the Grand Isle Port Commission to use specified portions of certain water bottoms, water columns, and water surfaces for a seafood research program undertaken in cooperation with the Louisiana Sea Grant program.

Proposed law modifies certain points identified in present law.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the port commission adhere to rules and regulations adopted by the La. Wildlife and Fisheries commission governing alternative oyster culture activity.
