HEALTH CARE.Provides relative to the Louisiana Tumor Registry. (gov sig)

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 40:1103.3(A), 1103.5(4), 1105.1(1), 1105.3(4), 1105.5,
3	1105.8.1(D)(1)(b)(iii) and (G), and 1105.9(A)(1), (B), (C)(1), (D), (E), and (F),
4	1105.12(F)(4), and 1105.13(C) and R.S. 47:120.63, to enact R.S. 40:1105.1(8), and
5	to repeal R.S. 40:1105.11, relative to the Louisiana Tumor Registry; to provide for
6	definitions; to provide for powers and duties of the president of the Louisiana State
7	University System; to provide for requirements for participation in the program; to
8	provide relative to the board; and to provide for related matters.
9	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
10	Section 1. R.S. 40:1103.3(A), 1103.5(4), 1105.1(1), 1105.3(4), 1105.5,
11	1105.8.1(D)(1)(b)(iii) and (G), and 1105.9(A)(1), (B), (C)(1), (D), (E), and (F),
12	1105.12(F)(4), and 1105.13(C) are hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 40:1105.1(8) is
13	hereby enacted to read as follows:
14	§1103.3. Standard written summary of breast cancer alternatives
15	A. Pursuant to the provisions of this Part and no later than March 1, 2000, the
16	department, in consultation with the Louisiana Cancer and Lung Trust Fund
17	Advisory Board, shall develop a standard written summary of the advantages,

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1	disadvantages, risks, and descriptions of the procedures regarding medically viable				
2	and efficacious alternative methods of treatment for breast cancer including surgical,				
3	radiological, or chemotherapeutic treatments or combinations thereof. Thereafter, the				
4	department shall review and, if necessary, revise the summary every three years;				
5	however, the department shall revise the summary prior to the three-year review if				
6	the department determines that new or revised information should be included in the				
7	summary.

9	§1103.5. Information and access to breast reconstructive surgery				
10	Every hospital licensed by the Louisiana Department of Health pursuant to				
11	R.S. 40:2100 et seq., and every Louisiana physician who provides mastectomy				
12	surgery, lymph node dissection, or a lumpectomy shall provide information to the				
13	patient concerning the option of reconstructive surgery following such procedures,				
14	including the availability of coverage for reconstructive surgery, in accordance with				
15	the state insurance law and applicable provisions of federal law. The information				
16	shall be provided to the patient in writing and in advance of obtaining consent to the				
17	surgical procedure. At a minimum, the information provided shall include the				
18	following:

20	(4) Other information as may be required by the secretary of health,				
21	consistent with information developed by the Louisiana Department of Health and				
22	the Louisiana Cancer and Lung Trust Fund Advisory Board and circulated to				
23	providers and patients by the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners.

(1) "Board" shall mean the Louisiana Cancer and Lung Trust Fund Advisory Board.

(8) "Tumor registry", "Cancer registry program", and "statewide

11	A. Any health care provider or radiation center participating hospital
12	diagnosing or providing treatment to cancer patients shall report each case of cancer
13	to the president in a format prescribed by the president within six months of
14	admission or diagnosis and shall furnish the data, including but not limited to
15	follow-ups, medical history, risk factors, and cancer screening, on each cancer
16	patient when requested. If the facility fails to report in a format prescribed by the
17	president, the president may <u>remotely access the records or</u> enter the facility, <u>and</u>
18	obtain the information, and report it in the appropriate format. In these cases, the
19	facility shall reimburse the president Louisiana Tumor Registry for the cost of
20	obtaining and reporting the information.
21	B. Any health care provider or radiation center diagnosing or providing
22	treatment to cancer patients shall report each cancer case. In addition, health care
23	providers shall furnish follow-up data on each cancer patient when requested.
24	Participating hospitals shall grant the president access to cancer patient
25	records, as well as allow access to all records which would identify cases of
26	cancer to ascertain and abstract reportable cancer cases by the statewide
27	registry program.
28	C. Pathology laboratories, radiation centers, surgery centers, physicians
29	and other licensed healthcare facilities and providers shall report cancer cases

1	in the required electronic format to the statewide registry program and grant					
2	access to cancer patient records. These facilities and providers shall allow access					
3	to all records which would identify cases of cancer to ascertain and abstract					
4	reportable cancer cases by the statewide cancer registry program.					
5	C . $\underline{\mathbf{D}}$. Any health care provider or radiation center which provides diagnostic					
6	or treatment services to patients with cancer shall report any additional demographic,					
7	diagnostic, or treatment information requested by the president concerning any					
8	person presently or previously receiving services who has or had a malignant tumor.					
9	Additionally, the president shall have physical access to all records which would					
10	identify cases of cancer or would establish characteristics of the cancer, treatment of					
11	the cancer, or medical status of any identified cancer patient.

24	G. The tumor registry shall annually prepare a statistical report concerning					
25	cancer rates and counts which includes data at the census tract level, and shall submit					
26	the report to the office of the president for inclusion with the annual cancer report					
27	required by R.S. 40:1105.10. The tumor registry shall also provide the statistical					
28	report required by this Subsection to the Louisiana State University Health Sciences					

Center at New Orleans, the Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center at

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1	Shreveport, the Louisiana Cancer and Lung Trust Fund Advisory Board, and each				
2	participating hospital.

4	§1105.9. Louisiana Cancer and Lung Trust Fund Advisory Board				
5	A.(1) There is hereby created the Louisiana Cancer and Lung Trust Fund				
6	Advisory Board, which shall consist of the following members appointed and				
7	reappointed by the governor, to serve at his pleasure, upon recommendation of each				
8	institution and organization represented:				
9	(a) A representative from Tulane University School of Medicine.				
10	(b) A representative from the Louisiana State University School of Medicine,				
11	<u>Health Sciences Center -</u> New Orleans.				
12	(c) A representative from the Louisiana State University School of Medicine,

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B. The board shall determine the eligibility of medical research programs and clinical investigation and training projects to receive funds; however, sufficient Sufficient funds shall be allocated annually to the statewide registry program for reporting cancer cases under the provisions of R.S. 40:1105.1 et seq. Administration of funds shall be exercised by the office of the president.

C.(1) The board shall establish rules and regulations for its own procedures, establish policies for the operation of the statewide registry program for reporting cancer cases established under the provisions of R.S. 40:1105.1 et seq.; and establish procedures for the allocation of any monies collected for the purposes of cancer prevention, control, or surveillance in Louisiana criteria for review panels, and establish guidelines and deadlines for grant applications to be submitted. The appointment of review panels for the purpose of evaluating grant applications and making recommendations to the board on a priority basis shall be made before monies are allocated. Any member of the board or review panels with a direct conflict of interest shall excuse recuse himself or herself from voting on any grant proposal the allocation of monies.

- D. For purposes of this Section, the following definitions shall apply:
- (1) "Clinical investigation" shall mean the application of the results of medical research to treat patients.
- (2) "Medical research" shall mean a program to determine the cause and prevention of disease.
- (3) "Training" shall mean the educational preparation for a subspecialist career in cancer or lung disease.

E. A current report on the programs funded shall be made to the House Committee on Ways and Means and to the Senate Committee on Revenue and Fiscal Affairs, meeting jointly, prior to each regular session of the legislature.

F.E. Any member of the board or of a review panel, whether or not such member is compensated by the institution or organization he represents, shall recuse

1	himself from participating in any discussion or voting regarding any matter relating				
2	to awarding a grant or contracting with the institution or organization he is appointed				
3	to represent. No member of the board or of a review panel who complies with the				
4	recusal provisions contained in this Subsection shall be deemed to have violated the

26	C. To implement the	provisi	ons of t	his Section, there shall be a breast cancer	
27	control agent in each of the Louisiana Department of Health regions, and all agents				
28	shall provide individual annu	ıal repo	rts to th	e Louisiana Cancer and Lung Trust Fund	

Advisory Board. The breast cancer control agents will be responsible for increasing

the statewide mammography utilization rate by launching a statewide initiative and community outreach program to educate the public about the benefits of early detection and treatment of breast cancer. The breast cancer control agents shall seek additional sources of funding, both public and private, including federal grants made available to states through 42 U.S.C. 300(k) et seq.

Section 2. R.S. 47:120.63 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: §120.63. Income tax checkoff; donation for Louisiana cancer; creation; use of monies

A. Every individual who files an individual income tax return for the current tax year and who is entitled to a refund may designate on his current year return that all or any portion of the total amount of the refund to which he is entitled shall be donated to the Louisiana Cancer and Lung Trust Fund Advisory Board, created pursuant to R.S. 40:1299.88, for the purpose of combating cancer and research into a cure for the disease. The designation shall be made at the time of the filing of the current year tax return and shall be made upon the income tax return form as provided by the secretary of the Department of Revenue. No donation made under the provisions of this Subsection shall be invalid for lack of an authentic act.

B. Upon receipt of any taxpayer's current year income tax return upon which the designation of a donation has been made pursuant to Subsection A of this Section, the secretary shall enter in a central record the donation and the name of the donor. The secretary shall forward all such donations to the Louisiana Cancer and Lung Trust Fund Advisory Board annually, on or before March first of the year following the year in which the tax return was filed. The board shall use the monies derived from all such donations for the purpose of combating and researching cancer. Section 3. R.S. 40:1105.11 is hereby repealed.

Section 4. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If

1 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become

effective on the day following such approval.

Present law requires the LSU System president to establish the Louisiana Tumor Registry for reporting cancer cases for the purpose of gathering statistical data to aid in the assessment of cancer incidence, survival rates, possible causes of specific cancers, and other related aspects of cancer in Louisiana.

Present law establishes the Louisiana Cancer and Lung Trust Fund Board for the purpose of determining eligibility of medical research programs, clinical investigations, and training projects to receive funds.

Proposed law changes the name of the board from the Louisiana Cancer and Lung Trust Fund Board to the Louisiana Cancer Advisory Board and requires the board to establish procedures for allocating monies collected for the purpose of cancer prevention, control, and surveillance in Louisiana.

<u>Present law</u> requires the president to comply with reporting procedures and requirements established by the board.

Proposed law changes the responsibility of establishing the requirements from the board to the state, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and the National Cancer Institute.

Present law establishes procedures for health care providers and radiation center participating in the registry program.

<u>Proposed law</u> makes changes to those procedures and establishes additional procedures for participating hospitals.

Present law provides for the membership of the board.

Proposed law makes changes to the membership of the board.

Present law requires the office of the president to annually publish a comprehensive report on the incidence of cancer in Louisiana and the progress made in reducing or eliminating the high cancer rates in Louisiana.

Present law additionally requires the board to annually publish a comprehensive report on the incidence of lung cancer in Louisiana and the progress made in reducing or eliminating the high lung cancer rates in Louisiana.

Proposed law repeals the lung cancer reporting requirement of the board.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
